- **Jim Orman (Treasurer) –**
  - A. Pam Landon has done an outstanding job processing all of the retroactive paychecks to the employees. She supervised the effort and handled all of the questions from employees. She then made sure all of the checks were calculated correctly (not an easy job) and everyone received what was due to them. This was done above and beyond her normal duties following all of the year-end close-outs. This so impressed Cortney Haberlau (who assisted her) that Cortney nominated Pam for an “Employee First” award through Human Resources.
  - B. Since Jen Indelicato joined our office in 2012 she has processed 1431 installment agreements to assist delinquent taxpayers catch up on their taxes. In 2012 the rate of taxpayers defaulting on these agreements was 37%. In 2019 the rate of default was trending at 10% with the final figure to be calculated later. That is an incredible increase of taxpayers completing their agreements and an increase in the County receiving these back taxes. Jennie is to be commended in continuing to maintaining this success rate.

**WHEREAS**, Local Law No. \_\_\_\_\_ for the year 2020 was presented to the Cayuga County Legislature on January 30, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to law and after proper notice having been given, the County Legislature held a public hearing on said Local Law No. \_\_\_\_\_ for 2020 on February 25, 2020 at 6:00 P.M.; now, therefore be it

**ENACTED**, that the Cayuga County Legislature does hereby adopt Local Law No. \_\_\_\_\_ for 2020, a Local Law granting partial property tax exemption to certain seniors and disabled persons, setting income limits for the same; and repealing Local Law No. 5 of 1982; No. 3 of 1989; No. 2 of 1990; No. 4 of 1998; No. 3 of 2002; and No. 2 of; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the Clerk of the County Legislature publish notice of the adoption of the said Local Law in the official newspapers of Cayuga County, one time per week for each of two weeks, the first publication to be within ten (10) days of its effective date.

COUNTY OF CAYUGA  
LOCAL LAW NO. \_\_\_\_ OF THE YEAR OF 2020

**A LOCAL LAW GRANTING PARTIAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION TO CERTAIN SENIORS  
AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES, SETTING INCOME LIMITS FOR THE SAME; AND  
REPEALING LOCAL LAWS NO. 5 OF 1982; NO. 3 OF 1989; NO. 2 OF 1990; NO. 4 OF 1998; NO. 3  
OF 2002; AND NO. 2 OF 2007**

**Section 1.** The intent of this local law is to continue to provide a real property tax exemption to certain senior citizens in accordance with Section 467 of Real Property Tax Law, and certain disabled persons in accordance with Section 459-c of Real Property Tax Law, and to increase the income limits to allow the exemptions to be distributed in a more fair and equitable manner. Local Law No. 5 of 1998 pursuant to Real Property Tax Law Section 467(1)(b) shall remain in effect allowing certain unreimbursed expenses to offset the income used to determine exemption eligibility.

**Section 2.** Effective January 1, 2021, Cayuga County shall grant a real property tax exemption to certain individuals sixty-five (65) years of age and over, in accordance with Section 467 (1)(b) of the Real Property Tax Law.

**Section 3.** Effective January 1, 2021, Cayuga County shall grant a real property tax exemption to certain persons with disabilities and limited incomes in accordance with Section 459-c of the Real Property Tax Law.

**Section 4.** Effective January 1, 2021, the maximum income eligibility level for the 467 and 459-c exemptions shall be as follows:

up to 29,000.00	= 50% of assessed value exempt
29,000.01 up to 29,999.99	= 45% of assessed value exempt
30,000.00 up to 30,999.99	= 40% of assessed value exempt
31,000.00 up to 31,999.99	= 35% of assessed value exempt
32,000.00 up to 32,899.99	= 30% of assessed value exempt
32,900.00 up to 33,799.99	= 25% of assessed value exempt
33,800.00 up to 34,699.99	= 20% of assessed value exempt
34,700.00 up to 35,599.99	= 15% of assessed value exempt
35,600.00 up to 36,499.99	= 10% of assessed value exempt
36,500.00 up to 37,399.99	= 5% of assessed value exempt

**Section 5.** All other provisions of Section 467 and 459-c of Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York shall be in effect for the purpose of County real property taxation in Cayuga County.

**Section 6.** Local Law No. 4 of 1968, Local Law No. 3 of 1998 and Local Law No. 5 of 1998 shall remain in effect except as amended here.

**Section 7.** Severability. If any provision of this Local Law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, then such adjudication, shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the particular provision directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

**Section 8.** In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between this Local Law and any previous Local Law or Resolution of the County Legislature, the terms of this local law shall govern.

**Section 9.** Repealing Local Law No. 5 of 1982; Local Law No. 3 of 1989; Local Law No. 2 of 1990; Local Law No. 4 of 1998; Local Law No. 3 of 2002; Local Law No. 2 of 2007, effective January 1, 2021.

**Section 10.** Effective Date. This Local Law shall take effect immediately.

**AUTHORIZING THE REPLACEMENT OF A ROOFTOP HVAC UNIT SERVING THE HARDENBERG BUILDING**

WHEREAS, one of the rooftop units serving the Hardenberg Building is over 25 years old and is at the end of its useful life; and

WHEREAS, at the end last cooling season the AC compressor in the unit failed; and

WHEREAS, Cayuga County can purchase a replacement unit installed from the state bid supplier Johnson Controls for a price of \$23,982; and

WHEREAS, the replacement unit will be much more energy efficient than the old unit; and

WHEREAS, in the meantime the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds is asking to authorize the funds be approved from the General Fund Balance Account A19090 so that the equipment can be ordered in time for the upcoming cooling season; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Cayuga County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to sign an agreement with Johnson Controls, subject to approval by the County Attorney as to form; and be it further

**LOCAL LAW NO.: \_\_\_\_ OF 2020**

**COUNTY OF CAYUGA, STATE OF NEW YORK  
A LOCAL LAW REPEALING LOCAL NO. 5 OF 2018 AND ESTABLISHING THE  
DEPARTMENTS OF BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS, WEIGHTS AND MEASURES,  
AND THE CAYUGA COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT; ESTABLISHING THE  
POSITIONS OF SUPERINTENDENT OF BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS, DIRECTOR  
OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES, AND HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT.**

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of Cayuga County, State of New York as follows:

**SECTION 1: LEGISLATIVE INTENT**

It is the intent of this Local Law, consistent with the powers granted to county government pursuant to County Law § 400(a), the Municipal Home Rule Law, and such other laws as may be applicable, to:

- A. Disestablish the Department of Public Works in order to provide more comprehensive oversight over matters involving general highway, buildings and grounds, and weights and measures.

**SECTION 2: LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS**

The Cayuga County Legislature hereby finds as follows:

- A. Local Law No.: 2 of 1989 established the position of Director of Buildings and Grounds in the Cayuga County Buildings Department.
- B. Local Law No.: 2 of 1999 established the position of Director of Public Works providing for the oversight of all highways, bridges, road construction, parks, trails, and certain county buildings.
- C. Local Law No.: 1 of 2005 repealed Local Law 2 of 1989 and Local Law 2 of 1999, created the positions of Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds and the position of Cayuga County Highway Superintendent.
- D. Local Law 4 of 2014 created a Cayuga County Buildings and Grounds Department; established the position of Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds, and repealed sections 2, 3, and 7 of Local Law No. 1 of 2005.
- E. Local Law No.: 5 of 2018 Repealed Local 4 of 2014 and Local Law 1 of 2005.

**SECTION 3: DEPARTMENT OF BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS**

- A. There is hereby established the Department of Buildings and Grounds. The Department of Buildings and Grounds shall have charge of the preservation and maintenance of all buildings and grounds, parks and trails, and facilities owned or leased by the County which are held, used and/or operated by the County for County purposes.

- B. There is hereby established the position of Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds. The Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds shall have primary responsibility for fulfilling the charge of the Buildings and Grounds Department, as well as any additional responsibilities as may be assigned by the County Legislature. In addition, the Superintendent shall have charge, supervision, and management of:
1. All janitors, caretakers, custodians, building mechanics, and other employees responsible for the care and maintenance of County buildings and grounds;
  2. All employees involved with the design, construction, operating, maintenance and repair of all grounds, parking fields, drives and walks, together with all structures, roads, parking areas, equipment and appurtenances relating to parks and recreational facilities; and
  3. All parks and recreation programs.
- C. The Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds shall be appointed, without term, by the Cayuga County Legislature in accordance with Civil Service Law, Rules and Regulations, and County Policy, as the same may be amended from time to time.
- D. Notwithstanding the appointive authority of the Cayuga County Legislature, the Legislature may, by resolution, delegate administrative authority and general oversight of the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds to a County Administrator or Deputy, the Chairman of the Legislature, or the Chairman of the Oversight Committee to which the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds shall report.

### SECTION 3: DEPARTMENT OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES

- A. There is hereby established the Department of Weights and Measures. The Department of Weights and Measures shall have charge of the duties and functions as proscribed by § 775 of N.Y. County Law.
- B. There is hereby established the Director of Weights and Measures. The Director of Weights and Measures shall have primary responsibility for fulfilling the charge of the Weights and Measures Department, as well as any additional responsibilities as may be assigned by the County Legislature.
1. The Director of Weights and Measures shall be appointed, without term by the Cayuga County Legislature in accordance with Civil Service Law, Rules and Regulations, and County Policy, as the same may be amended from time to time.
  2. Notwithstanding the appointive authority of the Cayuga County Legislature, the Legislature may, by resolution, delegate administrative authority and general oversight of the Director of Weights and Measures to a County Administrator or Deputy, the Chairman of the Legislature, or the Chairman of the Oversight Committee to which the Director of Weights and Measures shall report.

### SECTION 4: HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

- A. There is hereby established the Cayuga County Highway Department. The Highway Department shall have charge of:

1. County Roads and County Bridges to the extent required under N.Y.S. and Federal Law;
  2. The motor pool for the purpose of maintaining the County's vehicles and highway equipment;
  3. The County sign shop;
- B. There is hereby created the Office of the Cayuga County Highway Superintendent. The Highway Superintendent shall have all the powers, duties, obligations, and liabilities imposed upon a county superintendent of highways by the N.Y. Highway Law, as well as such other duties as may be imposed by the County Legislature.
1. The Highway Superintendent shall be appointed to a four-year term, in accordance with N.Y. Highway Law, by the Cayuga County Legislature in accordance with Civil Service Law, Rules and Regulations, and County Policy, as the same may be amended from time to time.
  2. Notwithstanding the appointive authority of the Cayuga County Legislature, the Legislature may, by resolution, delegate administrative authority and general oversight of the Highway Superintendent to a County Administrator or Deputy, the Chairman of the Legislature, or the Chairman of the Oversight Committee to which the Highway Superintendent shall report.

**SECTION 5:** REPEALER. Local Law No. 5 of 2018 is hereby repealed.

**SECTION 6:** SAVINGS CLAUSE. If any portion of this Law shall be adjudged by the courts to be invalid, it is the intention of the Legislature that said judgment shall not affect the remainder thereof if the remainder is sufficient to carry out the intent of this Law.

**SECTION 7:** EFFECTIVE DATE. This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State.
