DEPARTMENT UPDATES FOR COMMITTEE:

Brenda Wiemann (Office for the Aging) -

The Office for the Aging OFA COB office lacks sufficient space to safely accommodate clients in our small basement area. To resolve this, Chair McNabb Coleman and I did a walk-through of all potential basement space to look at expanding the OFA footprint.

Farmer's Market Coupon schedule is pending. New this year – drive through events at 8 locations throughout the county for income-eligible seniors.

Launching a virtual caregiver series called Powerful Tools for Caregivers using 8x8. Plan is to assist those in need to obtain short-term internet accessibility using CARES Act funding.

Kathleen Cuddy (Health) - No updates

Ray Bizzari (Mental Health/Social Services) –

Highlights:

- Will issue an RFP for the Family Finding/Foster Care Recruiting/Training contract
- Staff has returned to the MH Center
- Been several neglect removals over the past few weeks...foster care placements are increasing as families struggle to meet the needs of their kids

Stuff to Pay Attention To:

- \$400,000 (20%) OASAS/MH state aid reduction and its impact on agencies
- 91 overdoses/14 overdose deaths in 2020...HEALing Communities work distributed a few hundred NARCAN kits via on-line training/pop-up training sites
- Suicides up as well...treatment system starting to return to work so hopefully we can re-create the system of care work but it's a long road

FYI:

- Bringing a resolution in August for the Grant Avenue shelter operated by Chapel House to increase the rate, staffing and also to contract for security visits to local motels in an effort to control and monitor some of the dangerous behaviors occurring in the homeless population.
- Family First implementation work continues....a lot of local share money is at stake here
- As NYS opens up, workload increases for DSS/MH are complicated by up in the air waivers allowing telephonic
 interviews and automatic recertification extensions
- There is a plan to extend SNAP benefits to children who receive free or reduced lunches but whose families are not receiving assistance. Food insecurity is a local issue here.
- We've extended an offer to NAACP and Harriet Tubman Center for Peace and Justice for the leadership and staff of both departments to participate in a process where we work to reduce/eliminate implicit bias in our work
- OTDA is proposing some significant changes to Long Term Care/Medicaid that we are not staffed up for

WHEREAS, it is our hope, with this case management contract to determine service needs to enhance employability, overcome barriers to self-sufficiency and promote family stability including rapid housing; and

WHEREAS, since we will be focusing our efforts on TANF families, we can use our flexible fund allocation to cover the cost of this contract; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT
