OFA remains operational at our main office at COB M-F, 9-5 by phone and e-mail, or drop-off via security. Staff rotate in office 1/day per wk and work from home remainder.

Meals on Wheels program continues M-F for over 350 seniors, with 6 P/T and 2 F/T staff working daily. Verbal health screenings continue for volunteers; they are supplied with masks, hand sanitizer, and bags to leave meals with clients while maintaining a safe distance. We recognized our “Superheros” volunteers in April.

Authorization to accept additional funding from the NYS Office for Aging (NYSOFA) through the Corona Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act

WHEREAS, NYSOFA has received federal stimulus funds through CARES; and

WHEREAS, because New York State has received a Major Disaster Declaration (MDD) from the federal government, these grants can be used for any disaster relief services for older adults; and

WHEREAS, additional funding in the total amount of \$176,024 has been allocated from NYSOFA to Cayuga County through the Cayuga County Office for Aging under three separate grants- CARES Act for Nutrition Services (HDC3- \$106,876), CARES Act for Supportive Services (SSC3-\$45,200) and CARES Act for Family Caregiver Support Program (FCC3-\$23,948); and

WHEREAS, the Office for the Aging 2020 budget needs to be amended to reflect the additional funding and services to be provided; now therefore be it

Amending resolution 416-16 to reflect recently adjusted increases to the NYSDOH Early Intervention Administration Grant for year 4 (10/1/2019-9/30/2020) and year 5 (10/1/2020-9/30/2021)

WHEREAS, the State of New York has made money available to county governments for the purpose of meeting their administrative responsibilities in local oversight and implementation of the Early Intervention Program (a state-mandated program) for the period October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2021 in the amount of \$35,996 annually; and

WHEREAS, the State of New York has notified Cayuga County that adjustments in funding are being made to year 4 10/1/2019-9/30/2020 and year 5 10/01/2020-9/30/2021 of the five year Early Intervention Administration grant; and

WHEREAS, New York State has sited that this increase is in to the recent Public Health Law amendment and subsequent regulatory change to 10 NYCRR subpart 67-1, which updated the definition of “elevated blood lead level.”; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, the Public Health Director be authorized to accept the increased funding for year 4 and 5 of the 5-year Early Intervention Administration grant and any other funding that may be distributed in relation to this grant; and be it further

Authorizing the Chairman of the Legislature and the Director of Community Services to Enter into a Contract with the Fort Hill Cemetery to Provide for Indigent Burials

WHEREAS, the County has an obligation to provide burials to indigent persons without available resources; and

WHEREAS, in the past Fort Hill Cemetery has agreed to provide burial plots for indigent persons at a reasonable cost to the County; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Social Services desires to continue this arrangement with the Fort Hill Cemetery; and

WHEREAS, Fort Hill Cemetery has agreed to provide us with burial plots at the cost of up to \$850 per plot; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Legislature and the Director of Community Services be authorized to enter into a contract with Fort Hill Cemetery for the purchase of burial plots for indigent persons for the period of January 1, 2020, to December 31, 2024, at a cost of up to \$850 per plot; and be it further

RESOLVED, that these expenses be paid from account #61404 54000 (Safety Net) of the Department of Social Services Budget.

HS Rescue Mission Contract

Authorizing the Chairman of the Legislature and the Director of Community Services to Renew the Contract with Rescue Mission for Homeless Family and Transitional Housing

Christopher Petrus, Chairman of the Ways & Means Committee

WHEREAS, the Rescue Mission is leasing a building from Auburn Housing Authority that consists of a total of eight units, including 2 one-bedroom units, 2 two-bedroom units, and 4 three-bedroom units; and

WHEREAS, the Rescue Mission will furnish the units, will enter into an occupancy agreement with housing participants, and will provide needed case management services necessary to move participants to permanent housing; and

WHEREAS, the maximum length of stay in these units will be for 90-days with the goal of transitioning most households to appropriate permanent housing in 30 days; and

WHEREAS, this transitional housing program represents a cost-effective alternative to placing families and single women in hotels with better long-term outcomes; and

WHEREAS, the transitional housing program has been extremely successful in providing long term housing to clients and the department would like to expand the transitional housing program; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Legislature and the Director of Community Services renew the Department’s contract with the Rescue Mission for the period May 1, 2020, through April 30, 2021, at a Department cost of \$95,000 per year; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the cost of this contract will be paid from account #A61094 54000 or A61404 54000 depending on eligibility.
