- **Kelly Anderson (Real Property) –**

**AUTHORIZATION TO APPROVE WORK ON COUNTY HIGHWAYS IN ADDITION TO THOSE APPROVED PER RESOLUTION 218-20**

WHEREAS, the County is responsible for the maintenance of 513 miles of road; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 218-20 authorized the expenditure of \$2,783,277.54 to pave 8.54 miles of roads and \$90,300 to oil and chip 6.02 miles of roads; and

WHEREAS, the Highway Department working with our vendors have reduced the projected cost of Resolution 218-20 to \$1,270,465 saving \$1,512,812 that can be used for other roads; and

WHEREAS, the highway department has identified additional County roads that are in need of paving and County roads that are in need of resurfacing, per the attached list; and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the roads the Highway Department is proposing to pave and resurface for 2020 is as follows:

- Resolution 218-20 \$1,270,465
- Additional Roads per attached \$ \_\_\_\_\_

WHEREAS, Highway budget included funding for paving as follows:

- D51134-54099 Paving \$2,900,000
- D51104-54095 Surface Treatment \$650,000
- For a budget total of \$3,550,000

WHEREAS, the CHIPS, Pave NY and Extreme Winter Recovery funding for 2020 appears to be as follows, in accordance with the most recent notifications received by the Highway Department and the availability of funds from 2019:

WHEREAS, budgeted revenues for CHIPS, PaveNY, Extreme Winter total \$4,144,388; and

WHEREAS, the attached spreadsheets, one for paving and one for resurfacing, are prioritized lists of the roads we are proposing to repair/maintain; now therefore be it

CCWSA Dist. Funding (2/3)

**AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATION OF \$82,000 FROM THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT RESERVE TO THE CAYUGA COUNTY WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY FOR THE PURPOSES OF CREATING A CENTRAL WATER DISTRICT (2/3 Required)**

WHEREAS, the Cayuga County Legislature recognizes that public health, public safety, economic vitality and protection of water quality all depend on reliable, affordable and available municipal water and sewer infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, in the absence of a regional water system the city of Auburn has become a de facto regional water supplier over the past 100 years by selling treated Owasco Lake water to an estimated 15,800 residents outside the city limits; and

WHEREAS, the city of Auburn has successfully provided a safe water supply for many years, its system is over 100 years old and has several points of potential failure; and

WHEREAS, the CCWSA, with funding support from the Cayuga County Legislature, has completed a master plan to determine the most cost effective method of providing reliable water and sewer services to Cayuga County residents for the next 100 years; and

WHEREAS, for decades a second regional source of water supply has been desired to provide reliability, expand service, provide emergency backup for existing customers and offer direct wholesale service to towns and villages; and

WHEREAS, the Master Plan prepared by the engineering firm of Barton & Loguidice reviewed options for a second source of water supply separate from Owasco Lake and determined that a deep water intake in Cayuga Lake would meet the criteria established for a new source at the lowest cost to the end user; and

WHEREAS, the Master Plan also concluded that developing the new source as an element of a new regional water supply system would be the most economical approach; and

WHEREAS, on August 27, 2019 the Cayuga County Legislature adopted the master plan and provided its support for the CCWSA to lead the regional approach to meeting water and sewer needs of Cayuga County; and

WHEREAS, the Master Plan suggested the creation of a new regional water district that would provide for participation and cost sharing among all benefiting customers; and

WHEREAS, the Cayuga County Legislature has the authority to create such a multi-jurisdictional water district and would do so subject to a referendum of property owners within the proposed District; and

WHEREAS, a detailed analysis of proposed District boundaries, project costs and assessments to properties that will benefit from the new system must be completed to provide property owners with information to make an informed decision and to meet mandates of State law; and

WHEREAS, the CCWSA has estimates that it will cost up to \$82,000 to complete the analysis and provide for materials and presentations to inform the affected property owners of the proposed District; and

WHEREAS, Cayuga County desires to provide financial support to conduct the work necessary to provide property owners with a basis from which to make an informed decision and meet requirements of State law for District formation; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Cayuga County Legislature will provide up to \$82,000 to CCWSA to retain an engineering firm to conduct the analyses necessary to determine costs and assessments associated with development and operation of the proposed Cayuga Regional Water District; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the funds are available from the Economic Development Resource Allocation within the County's unrestricted and unappropriated fund balance; and be it further

RESOLVED, that if the District is created the County will be reimbursed for their cost contribution for the District formation report and related activities pursuant to § 253 of N.Y. County Law.
