PUBLIC BE HEARD:

If you wish to speak notify your Legislator, who will grant you privilege of the floor. You will be allowed to speak for 3 to 5 minutes. You must state your name and address. Legislator Timothy Lattimore for Kevin Cox, I have some concerns regarding one of the resolutions to be presented tonight on the Schwartz Theater. The Musical Theater Festival has not been able to raise the money it was supposed to raise, specifically the 3.8 million dollars in matching funds. I refer you back to the September 27, 2011 resolution that stated that the project shall not commence until 100% of all funding for all sources is made available; specifically the 50% matching funds that is going to be provided by the Musical Theater Festival, 3.8 million. The 50% matching funds had to be received and in place before any of this project started. From the looks of the resolution now, it appears that the project is now going to be phased, I assume that is because the Musical Theater Festival has not been able to raise the funds that it represented it could. This resolution is contrary to the September resolution and to the representation made to the State Senate in agreeing to provide

those matching funds. The sources that I have, say the Senate isn't going to provide any of that money until the Musical Theatre Festival has placed their 3.8 million up front. The concern should be that if the money is not there and this project proceeds in piece meal fashion in the way it is being proposed, you are going to end up, going out to bid, someone is going to low ball it and you're going to have change orders and who is going to pay for those. The Musical Theatre Festival is going to come to you and ask you to pay for the change orders; it will be an emergency situation, a crisis situation and you will be left holding the bag. I urge you not to approve any resolution until the Musical Theatre Festival has come forward and provided the 3.8 million in matching funds that they are obligated to do.

Larson, bids went out the end of 2011, 3 different packages, because we knew the demolition needed to be completed before we could get started and we wanted the steel for the 2^{nd} floor. The bids came back 16% under budget and local companies came back as winning bidders.

Lattimore, the Governor stands strongly behind the community colleges.

Larson, yes he does, feels very strongly about getting our work force retrained.

Fearon, the Governor's budget doesn't fully fund any increase that we have our school projects.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT: Tom Squires, the Treasurer's office is currently working on closing the books for year 2011, and in mid February we should have good preliminary numbers. The State budget has been released, proposed by the Governor, in that is the cap on Medicaid growth, the Medicaid bill for the County is 14 million and change for 2012. As it stands now we could chart out what the cost for Medicaid would be in future years, because we had a cap of 3% growth. The State budget beginning with the 2013-2014 State fiscal year, is going to cap the growth at 2%, reduce the cap to 1% growth the following year and the following year make it flat. That will be a very positive thing for all counties, it's not the full takeover of the Medicaid costs that we would like to see, but the reality in Albany is that's not a reality, enormous expense. The State budget also introduces a tier 6, which would reduce retirement costs, unfortunately for us, only for new employees. In looking forward to the 2015 budget, we have new debt coming on, 911 project, additional borrowing for the college project, and we

have existing debt on our books. We have been working very closely with, myself, County Attorney, Lynn Marinelli, the Treasurer Office. Paul Padlick in the Treasurer's Office has worked very hard in lining up what our debt is, cash position, and trying to project that into our upcoming year, as we go through the year I will report back to you. I will be meeting later this week with Nursing Home Director Deb English and a couple of other Nursing Home and we will be looking at how do we keep our long term beds in the community. Deb and I expect to have a resolution in February making a recommendation regarding a consultant to come in and help the community look at the long term care beds in our community and try help us chart a course to keep those beds. The NYSAC Conference is next week, there is a lot of good information there. Leadership Cayuga is in attendance tonight and will be doing a mock Legislature Meeting on February 2, 2012 in the chambers; all Legislators' are welcome, starts at noon. Every month we have a vendor come in and serve lunch and we do a 50/50 raffle that helps offset the cost of supplies. Larry Wilt, Director of the Veterans Office has received letters thank him for is help.

I have had discussions with the County Administrator regarding the spruce tree in front of the Old Historic Post Office, I have directed that he develop alternatives to cutting down the tree and bring them to committee next month. The Economic Forecast Luncheon will be this Thursday at noon, Holiday Inn, cost is \$35.00, if you're planning on attending please let Mary Jones, Clerk of the Legislature know.

WHEREAS, the New York State Deferred Compensation Board (the "Board"), pursuant to Section 5 of the New York State Finance Law ("Section 5") and the Regulations of the New York State Deferred Compensation Board (the "Regulations"), has promulgated the Plan Document of the Deferred Compensation Plan for Employees of Cayuga County (the "Model Plan") and offers the Model Plan for adoption by local employers;

WHEREAS, Cayuga County, pursuant to Section 5 and the Regulations, has adopted and currently administers the Model Plan known as the Deferred Compensation Plan for Employees of Cayuga County.

WHEREAS, effective August 26, 2011 the Board amended the Model Plan to adopt provisions

- Reorganizing and updating sections to improve the overall readability and eliminate unnecessary numerical references (annual limits) from the Model Plan document.
- Including employer elections within the plan document including: suspension of deferrals following an unforeseeable emergency withdrawal, automatic distributions from small and inactive accounts, loan design parameters and Roth deferrals and in-plan conversions are permissive. The Model Plan document includes a Schedule A where the employer may indicate the election of one or more of these provisions.
- Clarifying the first date a participant may make deferrals in compliance with Code Section 457(b) and timing requirements for any subsequent changes to deferral rates or allocations between pre-tax and after-tax deferrals.
- Clarifying compensation available for deferral for purposes of calculating contributions and recognizes that employers use various methods in determining the order of deductions taken before a deferral percentage is applied.
- Including provisions related to HEART Act of 2008 regarding treatment of differential pay and qualifying distributions for active military service in compliance with the HEART Act, including suspension of deferrals for six months following distribution.
 - Making technical recognition of the waiver of RMDs for 2009.
- Clarifying that a beneficiary form must be received in good order to be considered valid.
- Clarifying that the Model Plan will only accept rollovers from Eligible Retirement Plans comprised of pre-tax amounts and amounts may be rolled in by participants, beneficiaries (other than inherited accounts) and alternate payees. Model Plans may roll account balances out to Eligible Retirement Plans that include post-tax amounts if the receiving plan separately accounts for them.
- Clarifying that a beneficiary of a deceased participant may roll a distribution directly to a Roth IRA, in addition to plan participants.
- Including language allowing for future delivery of participant communications through electronic means, where appropriate.
- Codifying that periodic and lump sum payments must be a minimum of \$100 per payment, unless the Committee selects a different minimum, and sets a maximum annual number of partial distributions.
- Clarifying that the \$50,000 loan limit includes the highest loan value in the last twelve months from the Model Plan and other employer plans. Regarding participants who have defaulted on a Plan loan, subsequent loans would not be allowed until defaulted loan is repaid. Removes requirement that a participant must wait until the term of the original loan expires before applying for a new loan, assuming the defaulted loan is repaid.
- Providing guidance on the handling of the receipt of special proceeds such as SEC settlements payable to former participants.
 - Allowing a surviving spouse beneficiary to name a beneficiary on their account.
- Including the 5 year option for non-spousal beneficiaries to receive distributions and makes distribution rules consistent for pre- and post-age $70\frac{1}{2}$ deaths.

- Allowing earlier distributions due to severance of employment as long as a balance of \$500 remains in the account for 45 days after a severance from employment.
- Providing that outstanding loans from another New York state 457(b) plan may be allowed to be transferred or rolled in with a full account transfer.
- Removing the Power of Attorney Language since the acceptance of a power of attorney is governed by State law and not required in the Model Plan document.
- Clarifying the requirement that Committee actions must be taken at a public meeting in accordance with Article 7 of the Public Officers Law.
 - Limiting indemnification to Committee Members only.

WHEREAS, the Board has offered for adoption the amended and restated Model Plan to each Model Plan sponsored by a local employer in accordance with the Regulations; and

WHEREAS, upon due deliberation, Cayuga County has concluded that it is prudent and appropriate to amend the Deferred Compensation Plan for Employees of Cayuga County by adopting the amended Model Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that Cayuga County hereby amends the Deferred Compensation Plan for Employees of Cayuga County by adopting the amended Model Plan effective August 26, 2011, including the optional provisions in Schedule A, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A.

WHEREAS, for the last four years the Cayuga County Legislature has passed resolutions allowing an agreement with the Oswego Valley ATV Club to allow ATV use on specific sections of the county trail on a year to year basis; and

WHEREAS, the Oswego Valley ATV Club has agreed to install and maintain proper signage on the trail and to assist with the maintenance of the trail before and during the period and to provide insurance acceptable to the County; and

WHEREAS, for 2012 AND 2013 the Oswego Valley ATV Club has again requested permission to include the Hojack Trail from Oswego County west to the Cato/Fair haven Trail and for the entire length of the Cato/Fair Haven Trail; and

WHEREAS, the Oswego Valley ATV Club has successfully completed another year of using and assisting with the maintenance of the trails; and

WHEREAS, the definition of an ATV is a 4 wheeled vehicle that travels on low pressure tires, with a seat that is straddled by the operator, and with handlebars for steering control. Riders are permitted but must maintain a safe position behind the driver. Vehicles such as LUV (Light Utility Vehicles) or UV (Utility Vehicles) which typically have side by side seats and a steering wheel, are not considered ATV's UNLESS THEY MEET THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES DEFINITION OF AN ATV AND ARE LICENSED AND REGISTERED AS AN ATV and will not be allowed to use the trail except for situations in which the club would need this type of vehicle for use in maintenance or repair of trails. ATV's must have stock, unmodified, factory installed exhaust systems with spark arresters. Motorcycles or any other 2 or 3 wheeled vehicles are not considered ATV's and therefore will not be allowed on trails. No homemade ATV will be considered an approved ATV by definition; and

WHEREAS, the proposed agreement is supported by the local politicians, the Park Commission and Legislators Whitman and Chapman; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Cayuga County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to sign an agreement with The Oswego Valley ATV Club to allow ATV use on the Cayuga County Hojack Trail from Oswego County west to the Cato/Fair

Discussion:

Axton, the price increases went through committee and Ways, I have handed out an amendment. We have finally got our heads above water with the help of the Emerson Foundation. Gary is doing a fantastic job out there and there are a lot of things we want to continue to do out there, but we need to insure we have proper revenue coming in so that park never gets into this disrepair again. I have spoken to many seniors and have not had one, except Mr. Chick who is here tonight, speak against the increase. Everyone that came up to talk to me welcomed some way to give to the park. Originally it was \$2.00 we were going to charge the seniors and handicap and in my amendment that is dropped to \$1.00 and the senior pass in half price. It is important that we continue revenue flow, continue to build the park, continue to grow and continue to maintain it. This will help ensure that the money we make stays in a separate account and will never allow that to happen again. I am hopeful that we establish that account and my grand kids will have a park to go to. With that I offer up the amendment that is on your desks, the highlight numbers are the ones I reduced from the original.

Fearon, I support this, but I would like to see no increase on handicap or seniors, someday we may have to have all these fees, but not yet.

Runkle, in Dave's proposal the daily parking fees for non-seniors and non-handicap is not being changed.

Aikman, I will be voting no on any parking considerations, I would like us to consider the Emerson proposal, I will be opposing any fee schedule at this time. The contract that we have with the concession right now is a 3 and 1/2 year contract, it isn't a forever contract, we are not locked in, we can negotiate another contract.

Mahunik, the parking daily for Onondaga County is \$4.00.

Duckett, some of them are \$4.00 and on weekends it is \$6.00.

Mahunik, so it is not overall picture of what they charge in Onondaga County, I know the lake park doesn't change anything.

Duckett, right, but they don't have swimming but they do have walking.

Chapman, initially I was against any increase in the park, I believe the park belongs to the people and we should take ever measure possible to keep them free as much as possible. However if you look at all the numbers and what we expect to realize from our vendor on this parcel year 2012 and knowing we can utilize some of that money for upkeep, I thing the minimal increase that is proposed in this amendment is reasonable and we may find that it is very much necessary to help upkeep the park.

Barski, I am not going to support any increase until we see what happens in 6month to a year.

Lattimore, the park will continue to have costs, we are going to need some kind of funding mechanism for the future.

Runkle, we have to look down the road.

Mahunik, Mr. Lattimore you have suggest that we have a million dollars invested in the infrastructure of the park, centered around the pavilion project. The parking fees would be dedicated to capital projects at the parks, I won't support the amendment or any parking fees, how much do you think you are going to gain by charging our senior citizens \$1.00 to go up there and park, what kind of capital improvement are we going to do for \$1.00. I think they deserve to be able to enjoy a view of the lake.

Axton, \$1.00 in my amendment, opposed to \$2.00 in the original.

Cuddeback, I agree we need a place for people to go and enjoy the scenic beauty of Emerson Park, but it also nice to have a parking lot that is safe to park, that they can walk across, that is what the parking fees have always been for. If there is an increase in flow because of the new venue, or upgraded venue then the wear and tear will increase as well. I was on the board in 2002 when the parking fee went in place and it was as critical debate as it is now. Make sure you all speak to this if you have something to say and we'll go from here.

Axton, it is very easy for us to push off the hard decision on a future Legislature. When I came on I said I'm going to make the hard decision now, whether it is popular or not, but it has to be one that is for the benefit for everyone. You have to do what is best for the parks future, if not the park won't be there.

Lattimore, Gary are you indorsing the change?

Duckett, the Park Commission supported the full change, I supported the full increases. Lattimore, so Dave's amendment would be something less?

Duckett, less than I would recommend, but the decisions are made here, we make recommendations.

Lattimore, what was the cost of the Merry-go-Round roof?

Duckett, about \$53,000.

Lattimore, where did that money come from?

Duckett, the taxpayers, offset by some revenue.

Amendment Passed by Majority vote.

Motion by Mahunik to amend the amendment, keep current parking fees as they are now, Little League Season pass leave at \$15.00, parking daily and season parking pass for senior and handicap at \$0, 2nd by Farrell.

Defeated by voice vote, all voting no, except Mahunik voting yes.

Chapman, communication #1 re: Bill Conners, employee of the County buildings department, stepped forward to help the staff of WIC do to staff illness, this is a fine example of the type of employees that Cayuga County has and I hope we continue to remember them. I suggest that all committees think about this for next month's meeting so that we can increase our team work and make everybody a member of the extra mile club.

Aikman, at last month's Government Operations meeting we talked about a new policy, Healthy meetings, at the meeting we agreed to ask the administrator to advance the idea of the Healthy Foods at our in house meetings. I would like to get the blessing of the Legislature and to ask the Clerk of the Legislature to inform other organizations that meet here, staff, and other committees to also follow the policy. COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT: Tom Squires, hand out attached.

Squires, at April Government Op's Meeting the Health Economics Group is coming in to give a presentation on the Dental Network Card. A few years ago the Legislature adopted a resolution that enabled Pro Act to offer a prescription card to residents of the county

that didn't have insurance coverage and this is similar, but with dental services. Treasurer Jim Orman held a pancake breakfast last Friday it is a way to thank employees and boast moral and at the same time it is also a food raiser for one of the local food pantries. People were asked to bring a food item to donate, this year's recipient was the King Ferry Food Pantry.

Lattimore, the numbers on sales tax, I heard that the numbers are down, you are indicating that the numbers are up 22%.

Squires, overall on an accrual basis we are up 13% compared to where we were last year at this time.

Lattimore, the city has been without a comptroller for some time, but they are indicating that their sales tax is a lot lower. I am concerned about that number, I don't know if it is true.

Squires, I believe it is the Treasurer's Office puts out a report and it breaks down the sales tax distribution between city, county, towns and villages. I believe the city sales tax is down, the city exercises their preemption right in regards to sales tax, so the city collects 50% of the sales tax that is collected in the city.

Lattimore, I'm questioning the sales tax numbers, I don't think there that high.

Squires, we don't get good information from the state and there are adjustments that come through.

Orman, adjustments were in January that is why we are up.

Squires, the state doesn't give us good information that is why it is hard to drill down to individual stores and then adjustments come through and it could go up or down.

Lattimore, the city is reporting less.

Squires, that number comes from the state, the break out of the sales tax.

Lattimore, I am concerned about that number.

In any possible case no legislator can have more than one vote in a Ways and Means Committee meeting.

At the current level the property is assessed for more than \$937,000, if this were to go on the county tax rolls, the county would stand to gain about \$8,000, total tax revenue that could be gained would be around \$30,000 for all the entities involved. I believe it is important that we take a stand and oppose the state giving away property. Legislator Axton I support what this resolution is trying to do and what it says, but I feel that possibly the Legislature should not interfere with town issues, we should be there to speak to some of them, offer our help, but not in a resolution form. I would hope that if Sennett does not have a plan for that property, that they would pass and let it go to auction. Legislator Runkle feels this resolution, although it is non-binding, would create a devices atmosphere between our County Legislature and our Towns. I think our towns are chartered to run their business within the geographical area, I don't feel that we as a Legislature should write something like this against any town, as far as tax revenue it's valued at a million dollars it will go to public auction, it will be sold for x amount, which will bring the property value down. The State law provides that, when State land is sold, that local municipality has first option to buy it, if they don't want then the county to which it is in can but it, if they don't want it, it goes to auction. I cannot support this. Legislator Fearon, agrees with Mr. Axton, but I would hope that Sennett would only take what they can use and put the rest back on the tax rolls. Legislator Mahunik, I agree with Dave and George, if we start opposing the actions of local municipalities, I think we are doing a disservice to Sennett and in going forward, does that mean that this body is going to look at every piece of property in this county and possible oppose it. Legislator Lattimore thinks the town should have first use of it.

- (3) Fire safety and property maintenance inspections of all multiple dwellings not included in paragraphs (1) or (2) of this subdivision, and all non-residential buildings, structures, uses and occupancies not included in paragraphs (1) or (2) of this subdivision, shall be performed in accordance with the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention Code.

Section 3: Partial Invalidity: If any section of this local law or local law No. 3 for the year 2007 shall be held unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective, in whole or in part, such determination shall not be deemed to affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder.

Section 4: This local law shall take effect immediately upon its being duly filed as provided by the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Stephen Lynch, Director of Planning and Economic Development and Terry Masterson Executive Director of the Cayuga Economic Development Agency Consolidated Funding Application Process at the State level, CFA process.

When Governor Cuomo came into his administration, economic development, jobs and streamlining government were his goals, in that he created what is called the Consolidated Funding Application or CFA. It is basically taking all the agencies that have discretionary funds that would get distributed and most of them on an open window during the year. They take all the money from the different agencies and put them together in one pot and put that money up for competitive proposals in a single funding round in a single consolidated application. Last year was the first year; there were a lot of challenges, but the county did very well. They created an on line system for applying for those grants, which as it own difficulties, but there is no grant that you can open up and look at, because it is intuitive, you go from having one screen to 40 screens as the agencies funding opportunities align themselves with what your answers are. It is not just open to municipalities; company's can apply also, anyone one that is eligible for State funding you can apply. Last year we worked with Cayuga Ingredients to prepare their request for funding from Empire State Development that was 4 million, we applied through the Town of Aurelius for \$750,000 for sewer station to accommodate the Cayuga Ingredients Milk Plant Project that was awarded, we applied for infrastructure structure for the IDA site that did not get funded. This year there will be one funding round, the window started around the first week in May and ends July 16, 2012. Last year the plan for CNY Regional Economic Development Strategies was one of the four top plans and got the highest number of awards across New York State. We are in the CFA process now and know that there are some projects we may be working on and some that are not shovel ready. A project is scored on 100 points; the Regional Council will review all of the projects and decide whether that project aligns itself with their strategies, their goals, if you meet 100%, the value of their score is 20points, 80 points stays with the State Agencies. This year they are going to look at the regions and see and rate how each community that got projects, how they have moved those forward.

Legislator Aikman, I went to the meeting at the Aurora Inn and they indicated that our Regional Plan was the best, so as not to let other regions not be funded in the future, a certain part of the money will be eligible for separate from the regions that didn't do so

well, so there will be a new differentiation of the pot, so you won't have access to the whole thing, because we did so well, we have access to a portion of it. More competitive in a different way.

Terry Masterson, different ways of separating out the funding.

Steve Lynch, Competition is strong, it's a challenging process, because it's really trying to fit all these projects and getting them ready with one window of opportunity. This grants take a lot of time to put together, a lot of leg work goes into each grant.

Terry Masterson, there is less funding in the first round, it has become more complicated. If you have a job ready project then you have a good chance of being looked at favorable. Many of the important challenges we face as a county is legacy work, infrastructure work and cultivating sites.

Steve Lynch, most of my colleagues across the state that engage in this process agree that it shouldn't be Economic Development Projects and project specific things, that are moving through this CFA process, that the stake holders would be much better served if those types of projects went through the same process they used to do.

Terry Masterson, CCEDA in cooperation with the Chamber and Community College, will hold on June 19, 2012 at the college, a half day event for all the manufacture's in the county to learn about, incentives, Regional Council, energy programs, workforce training. The results of this would be presented to the State Legislature the following week.

Legislator Aikman, Currier Plastics has already decided not to take their energy recharge, because the stipulation is such that the cost is going to be increased more than the incentive that was given, it is going to put their electricity demand at a new NYSEG designation and it is going to be a wash. They spent hours and hours of staff time to figure this out so they wasted a lot of time, energy and money to say no we don't want to take that, we are better off without it. They want that message to go back to the state to say this is not working for them, please ask them about this at that meeting.

Terry Masterson, we have two applicants in the county, Seward House, and the Abbott Inn, who have both said do we have to through this process, 250 question application, and then find out that we are not eligible, if that's the case we are not go to file, they don't want to waste their time.

Legislator Axton, asked Terry to get information to him to attend the round table, Terry, I will get that information to you.

Legislator Fearon, the Governor made it seem like it was new money, it's not and how they look at school and funding, and basically the fact that we did well last time around means good stuff.

Legislator Pecher, how did the Howland House and Sherwood get on the list, there was \$400,000 granted for that, nobody that I spoke with finds any value in it, except for the few people that sponsored it.

Terry Masterson, anybody can apply.

Steve Lynch, I would say it was because it was a great application on the other hand if you apply for a project that you feel is valid and good and it didn't get funded, good luck trying to find out why.

Legislator Fearon, in related to Howland, they don't have a clue as to where they are going to come with \$400,000 to match, which is what they have to do.

Pecher, and they are looking for another \$600,000 State Grant to run it for the first few years.

Legislator Aikman, was there any indication that the cost benefit analyses was very important in this round?

Steve Lynch, that is part of it, but it was kind of a technical thing, because of the way the grant was set up, the way that it was set up between the college that owns the assets and the people that were applying for the money, were two different entities.

Terry Masterson, Tim Lattimore, Steve Lynch and members of the IDA will be going to Batavia NY to hear about their efforts to recruit Milk Plant Producers to the county.

Tom Squires, private companies can apply, does that have to go through the Regional Council?

Steve Lynch, yes, all applications submitted electronically go to the Regional Council. Tom Squires, so the Regional Council gets together, gives thumbs up or down and creates the list that gets submitted?

Steve Lynch, no, there is an on line application, as long as you meet all the thresholds and say you are going do all the things you're supposed to do and the application gets submitted on or before the deadline. What happens to those applications is the Regional Council reviews them and the result is they are given 0 to 20 points, simultaneously the applications have gone to the State Agencies and they get up to 80 points and the results are added together and goes to Albany.

Tom Squires, what do we do as a community/county to identify projects to help to corral projects and get them into the process?

Terry Masterson, what are we all applying for, what are our important projects and make sure they are at the top so we have our best foot forward.

Tom Squires, with support from the Legislature and the County we can help get those projects into the pipeline as far as the Regional Council goes, so who needs to do what now?

Steve Lynch, this funding round, there are a number of projects, one that has a good shot of getting funded. The County has put a high priority on the water quality for Owasco Lake, created a Water Quality Management Council, which is a consortium of municipality's and the Department of State has a local waterfront revitalization program that provides money for things like Watershed Management Strategy Plan that would be a good candidate for funding, it has all the things they support. My staff is investigating those programs so that we are ready to answer those programs. The IDA for infrastructure, I've add the application ready for a year, the problem is the timing, they are not going to even make a recommendation on mid fall and by the time you get contracts in your hands it might be December or after the new year. I would have to have the road built for Cayuga Ingredients by the time the asphalt plants close in November, so I'm not sure that's the best project. We are working with the Town of Brutus and helped them create a Main Street Application for the Village of Weedsport, it did not get funded, it was for \$500,000, it was an ok plan, it was supported by a strategic plan, that we helped them secure. They expressed an interest in bring that back up, but it is a challenge for a number of reasons.

Tom Squires, what should the Legislature be doing?

Steve Lynch, if there are business's that know that they are going to make significant economic improvements that will lead to job creation, they need to talk to us, Terry, and we will look at it to see whether or not the project is compelling enough through the CFA process, after we have been through it a few times, we would be able to advise them. If there is work out there that needs to be done, that you've already prepared a foundation for, you have to work with your communities well in advance of the CFA round.

Terry Masterson, would it help if every 10 days to 2 weeks we gave you list of what we think are our current pending projects and if you have projects let us know.

Steve Lynch, we generally did that last year during the CFA process, got together with the Chamber of Commerce, City Finance Staff and some other stake holders and discussed what projects each had.

Tome Squires, you anticipate doing something similar?

Steve Lynch, yes.

Legislator Chapman, have either of you said down with Andrew Fish, Peggy Morin or Mayor Quill yet?

Steve Lynch, in regards to this CFA round, no.

Terry Masterson, Andrew and I talk every day.

Legislator Chapman, being that this is an online application, is there any latitude to make our application more noticeable to those that might have to review it?

Steve Lynch, yes, it doesn't matter that it is online, you can go talk to someone and say we have an application in, you can print it out, and talk to that person.

Legislator Chapman, if you're the person that has to review a number of applications and you look at them and they are fairly bland, is there something that you could insert into the content that could make it more outstanding and attractive to the person that is conducting that review?

Steve Lynch, a positive is a positive, if it is an Economic Development Project and it's got 650 jobs it will stand out, whatever the selection criteria is, you hope that you are strong in the priority areas.

Legislator Fearon, a 10 day update so the circle doesn't get any wider.

Legislator, I worked on the Currier CFA, they give you the formulas, this question will put you higher up, you have to meet these qualifications and if you can meet 10 out of 10 then you are going to get a better chance at funding, if only 2 out of 10 you're not going to advance. It is really a very rational process and at the point when it looked like Currier was going to get 8 out of 10, then Andrew Fish, Peggy Morin, the Mayor, Chairman at the time and Robert Simpson were called every 5 to 7 days, but in terms of that online thing follow what it says and if you forget something, you're out, it has to be to the letter.

Legislator Lattimore, Joanna Mahoney just got appointed to the NYS Power Authority, we have always discussed giving us an allotment for the Industrial Park. One of the projects that I think we should hitchhike on is Madison/Onondaga Broad Band, getting Wi-Fi down in Popular Ridge, it will help the farmers, can go on existing poles.

Terry Masterson, the broad band issue is part of the strategic plan for CEDA, Steve has meet with a number of the towns in Southern Cayuga, our schedule is to come out with a document in early July/August that says here are all the current technologies that can deliver broad band to rural areas, here are the costs, here are the ones we think are workable, not workable and then trying to see what we can actually put into the county. I will come back in August with this with more information.

Legislator Fearon, if you have broad band it creates more jobs, because people can do a lot of stuff from their location.

Legislator Aikman, those conservations about NYSERDA and the highway garage roof , is that something we are moving forward with in this round?

Tom Squires, that is the indent, but I don't know who is doing what right now.

Legislator Aikman, part of reason we are having this meeting tonight is to choose priorities, what projects we want to get behind.

Tom Squires, George Wethey was the first one that identified that, I put him in touch with Leann and I think they have been conversing.

Chairman Cuddeback, would that be fit under the CFA?

Legislator Aikman, you would have to go through the CFA to get it.

Legislator Chapman, the green roof, I hope there will be some accompany numbers for maintenance.

Steve Lynch, I talked with Tucker Whitman and others and I know there is a great interest in getting funding for dredging for Little Sodus Bay and I just wanted to mention why that might not be right, right now for a CFA application. The Department of State Grant that goes from west of Rochester all the way to Oswego is looking at the economic impacts of not doing the dredging and the cost if the dredging was done. Until we have that information from the Department of State Grant, we really don't have good documentation and the second part of that grant if going to be the public's participation once those numbers come out. It is a Federal Harbor, so I would think that federal money might be money might be available.

Terry Masterson, Little Sodus Bay funding is very important and I have talked with Ann Marie Buerkle and will be speaking with Senator Schumer in the future. This harbor is not necessarily just a recreational harbor but there are a lot of business's there as well that will be affected.

Legislator Chapman, our water and sewer infrastructure is that something that we would include or consider asking for funding.

Steve Lynch, absolutely if the Water and Sewer Authority has projects lined up, our office in the past has been instrumental in getting CDBG applications funded, outside of the CFA process, so if similar projects are out there and are ready to go, but my take is the state wants to see shovels in the ground, buildings get built, sewers in the ground, it is really those types of projects. I haven't talked to Warren at Water and Sewer, but if they have projects that are ready they should be considering the application.

Legislator Chapman, would it be wise to send an e-mail to our various departments? Chairman Cuddeback, good idea.

Legislator Lattimore, the meeting that we are going to in Batavia, we can see if the USDA has money available for infrastructure projects.

Legislator Farrell, in regards to Warren, there has been some conservation in regards to a secondary water supply from Onondaga County into the Town of Brutus also potential in the future for that development in Brutus for an industrial site. I think the magnitude of the plan he had on that, shovel ready, I don't know, but I do know there has been some research done on it. With our site in Aurelius, I understand that the roadway is not an option, is there anything that we are lacking for future development, the NYSEG substation getting beefed up, or anything else that we are lacking that we should be going for, for future development out there.

Steve Lynch, I wouldn't built more infrastructure than is already planned out there, because I think you want to wait and see what comes in the door. Looking long term down the road, we have Milk Plant; we have another 60 acre's out there of fine industrial land, zoned, with infrastructure in place, ready to support new economic development and we are hoping that park gets filled up.

Legislator Farrell, what is the conservation in regard to beefing up NYSEG substation, is this anything we should go after now?

Steve Lynch, that is a tough one to answer, NYSEG is charging the company for those improvements and will pass that cost all along to the company.

Legislator Didio, Water and Sewer around Owasco Lake, have you heard anything on this?

Steve Lynch, the Environments Facilities Corporation will put infrastructure funding into sewer districts and those types of things, I think you have to qualify. There is lot of ground work that has to be done put into place before you are ready for an application. Legislator Aikman, with the way the CFA works right now, two were successful and as part of their grant those jobs are counted, no more projects can happen in the park, we already gave you money for these jobs, so the way the CFA looks at it now is they can't give apply, because it looks like the same jobs and we are going to give the money to the company first rather than to the municipality when we are counting those jobs. Now that it is a CFA application we're actually in a less competitive position to get our infrastructure done through this program.

Steve Lynch, that is why it will be harder for me to get infrastructure based on Cayuga Ingredients.

Legislator Lattimore, that is one of the reasons we are going to Batavia, because they do have a milk plant, Yogurt Plant and several other plants.

Terry Masterson, 70% of the county is in a low cost power zone.

Chairman Cuddeback, so you are going provide us with a list of what current projects that you are working on?

Terry Masterson, yes.

Steve Lynch, I had an IDA meeting today and they authorized the water contract for engineering services for the road way infrastructure needed for the IDA site for Cayuga Ingredients to come in, I sent the notice to Engineer about 6:00 tonight, I hope when I get that back we can circulate bids and find out how much it is going to cost.

Legislator Paul Pinckney arrived at 7:19PM.

Motion by Fearon to go into Executive Session at 8:02PM, re: matters leading to the employment of a particular corporation, 2^{nd} by Pinckney, all in favor.

Motion by Pecher to come out of Executive Session at 8:35PM, 2nd by Chapman, all in favor.

Legislator Farrell, no matter which way the vote goes, I would just like to know what direction we are going to go, if we keep them for the duration for the rest of the year, establish a committee to look at alternatives, and if we decide not to keep them do the same thing.

Legislator Lattimore, should negotiate downward at this point.

Motion by Pinckney, to keep Wladis until the end of the year and to form a committee to discuss what direction we want to go in at that point, 2^{nd} by Didio.

Discussion:

Chairman Cuddeback, do you have any particulars on the fund?

Tom Squires, \$80,000 is what the amount would be for 6 months, \$5,000 a month for lobbying, \$8,000 a month for grant writing with an additional \$2,000 for expenses, it is what was budgeted for the first 6 months.

Chairman Cuddeback, and those funds would be drawn out of contingency?

Tom Squires, contingency or fund balance, the question earlier was there another source, un-appropriated fund balance might be a source as well.

Legislator Lattimore, the fees that are being charged presently, you said \$8,000 a month for grant writing?

Tom Squires, yes.

Legislator Lattimore, how many grants written in the time we've had Wladis and a what cost?

Tom Squires, an important point, it used to be we paid for grant writing on an hourly rate, so for a good part of last year it wasn't a flat fee.

Legislator Lattimore, makes the suggestion that we keep Wladis for lobbying purposes, but hire our own in house grant writing.

Legislator Pecher, I think we ought to separate the motion into 2 parts, fund or not fund Wladis.

Chairman Cuddeback, if you want to continue with the committee idea, that would be a good idea to bring up after. Would like to withdraw you motion, rephrase it? Legislator Pinckney, withdraws his Motion.

Chairman Cuddeback, would you like to rephrase it?

Motion by Pinckney to extend the contract with Wladis until the end of the year at current rate and take the money from the Contingency Account, 2^{nd} by Didio Discussion:

Tom Squires, contingency takes 2/3, un-appropriated fund balance takes majority.

Discussion:

Legislator Pecher, I doubt that the legality of taking it out of the Un-appropriated Fund Balance, my understanding is un-appropriated becomes part of the General Fund period. The only place you can take monies out of, if you haven't already budgeted for is another budget caption or Contingency Fund, Un-appropriated is already in the bag.

Chairman Cuddeback calls for a brief recess for Fred Westphal to check on this, at 8:44PM.

Meeting called back into order by Chairman Cuddeback at 8:53PM

Fred Westphal, I was asked if there could be appropriations out of the fund balance, the answer is yes, section 366, supplemental appropriation, the Board of Supervisor's during a fiscal year by resolution may make additional appropriation or increase existing appropriation, the funds therefore be provide from any unencumbered balances, the appropriation pursuant to section 364 can come out of the contingency fund pursuant to 365 for un-anticipated revenues and un-appropriated unreserved fund balances pursuant to section 366 or pursuant to local finance laws, so unlike the town it can be done and it does not take a 2/3 vote, simple majority.

Chairman Cuddeback, Mr. Pinckney would you like to withdraw your motion for having it come out of contingency?

Legislator Pinckney, yes, I withdraw motion.

Chairman Cuddeback, would you like to enter a new motion?

MOTION NO. 231-12

Motion by Pinckney, to amend motion to have money come out of the Un-appropriated Fund Balance until the end of the year, not to exceed $\$80,000, 2^{nd}$ by Didio.

Fred Westphal, you should think about adding an amendment that would permit the Chairman to sign the contract for the consulting side and the grant writing side.

Discussion:

Legislator Lattimore, I am concerned about the amount of money we are spending on lobbyist and the production and the grant writing side of it, if we could somehow restructure that into production of some type or the number of applications that go in. I think right now we haven't submitted enough grants for the amount of money we've paid, I don't think we are getting the amount of production from that side.

Legislator Axton, I agree, but I don't think we can do this now, we should put out for an RFP before the end of the year, but continue this until the end of the year, but in the mean time let's not stand on our toes let's keep moving forward and try to find ways to restructure.

Chairman Cuddeback, basically what you are doing tonight is renewing their current contract for another 6 months.

Legislator Axton, but in the mean time, we shouldn't be sitting on that, we should be figuring out where we want to be, we need to make a plan.

Tom Squires, it had been discussed, one way to generate more business for them or to get more bang for our buck maybe to let the towns and villages in the county know that if they need assistance in writing grants, lobbying that we can make that resource available.

Legislator Lattimore, I think that is a great idea, but the Chamber of Commerce has said that small business grant writing is available from them to the county.

County Attorney Fred Westphal, decision in the Camardo vs. the City of Auburn that decision did at least three things:

- 1. Annulled SEQRA determination by the city.
- 2. It remanded the case to the trial judge and
- 3. There was language in there that Mr. Camardo had brought other subsided challenges to the city's SEQRA determination the 4th Judicial Division found that they had no merit, no weight, that is a good thing for the next step. The next question is who is going to try to assume lead agency status, it my opinion that the city cannot assume lead agency status or continue lead agency status, because the demolition is done and the property has been transferred to the county. The college is interested in the project still; the County is going on record in support of the project. In my analyses the most likely lead agency or entity to request lead agency status is the Legislature. Is the County Legislature interested in being, applying for lead agency status on the project and if so do you want a resolution prepared for Ways & Means next Tuesday to move that process forward?

Axton, if we do agree to take lead agency status and something is found, some environmental issue, additional cost, we would obviously be liable for those.

Westphal, that would start several discussions, it's County owned property, if it is a mess, then the County would take control of that, but the testing to date has found only trace elements of volatile organic chemicals.

Axton, on the original resolution we made sure it was worded that we wouldn't take ownership until we were assured that all the environmental issues were none existent.

Westphal, that testing was done in May of 2011 and that report is available, it lists only minor trace amounts of

volatile organic chemicals. They did soil samples, is that a guarantee, no, unless you bore in every square inch you don't know.

Lattimore, the city said go with the short form, now the county and the college have to go with the long form?

Westphal, not necessarily, the present design includes the remediation measure identified by the city, so that may not require a long form, that is going to be part of the process to determine what type of form is required.

Pecher, isn't there some way it can be turned back to the city, it seemed like we were sold a bill of goods. The environmental impact study wasn't done correctly; we went forward on the basis that it was done correctly. It should be back in the city's ballpark, their game, not ours, shouldn't tie up your time again, you have other things to do.

Westphal, I see two separate issues, one is, what are the environmental factors on a piece of property, minor releases of volatile organic chemicals, none of which are off the chart, none of which appear to be dangerous, at least from the standpoint of the company that reviewed it. The issue of SEQRA is separate and apart from the environmental concern, the SEQRA is a process that has to predate, preapproved prior to the start of the construction. I don't think the city can do SEQRA at this point, they don't own the land, and the structure is down. There is case out of the court department that several months ago, the only ability the city could have would be to issue a building permit, that is under discussion as to whether the city has that ability, my analyses says they can't do it.

Pecher, why can't the college take it over?

Westphal, they are the applicant and generally the applicant is not the lead agency. The Dormitory Authority is the other agency that could possibly assume lead agency status. Fearon, my understanding, if we used a little bit different wording it would've applied. Westphal, I don't pretend to be able to get into the minds of the judges who make the decisions, so I really can't really answer what they were thinking.

Runkle, what do we stand to lose if we don't take lead agency?

Westphal, at some point if we continue with this we might want to adjourn for legal advice, we are close to that line.

Farrell, if we take this issue out of the equation, before this problem arose, who was lead agency?

Westphal, the City Council was lead agency.

Farrell, I'm talking about before this court ruling a week ago, ten days ago, who was lead agency on this project?

Westphal, the city was.

Farrell, they still were even though they gave the property to us?

Westphal, yes, the SEQRA was issued in May of 2011 and it has taken this long for the appeal process to work through.

Farrell, so you're saying they can't be lead agency now on the SEQRA?

Westphal, that is correct, they have no skin in the game so to speak, the best they could do is issue a building permit and that is not enough discretionary authority to apply for or be awarded lead agency status.

Farrell, you're telling me they were lead agency but you're saying they can't do the SEQRA review.

Westphal, go back in time, as the lead agency status, the city role was to demolish the building, transfer the property and instead of segmenting the SEQRA process it took the project all the way from demolition to construction to operation of the college. The County could have been lead agency back in the fall of 2010, the County decided not to. Farrell, so the city was going to be lead agency on construction?

Westphal, there is no reason for the city to be lead agency on construction, once SEQRA is done and it is done properly that subject goes away, there's no need for lead agency. Farrell, who had code authority over building it?

Westphal, the county and still does if the project goes forward, no matter who lead agency is the code, is done by the county.

Lattimore, if for some reason there are some issues with environmental, does the college have a back-up program, do we have money.

Chamberlin, from the testing that has been done by AECC, they did testing before the building was demolished and after, they recommended a system to be installed and we have been assured by them to suspect any problem. Prior to looking at this site we have looked across the city for sites and could not identify another site that was appropriate and we looked pretty thoroughly. We did look at the Shrine Theater and that project would probably be least 50% more.

Lattimore, I thought being on the National Registry it might have more Federal Funding. Chamberlin, Federal Funding is almost nonexistent for this type of project.

Mahunik, if we take lead agency on this and something does pop up, we can have a discussion with the city and we do have some legal foot hole there with the resolution that we passed, so we wouldn't be totaling liable for environmental issues.

Westphal, we shouldn't, it would cause a discussion between the county and the city as far as what needs to be done, if anything.

Mahunik, but we do have options and recourse?

Westphal, yes.

Pecher, why do we want lead agency status when the college could assume it through the Dormitory Authority, why do we want it, don't we have enough to do?

Westphal, the county is in a better position than the Dormitory Authority in Albany, we are closer to the ground, we know the players, we can get access to all the research that was done by the city, incorporate that into the Environmental Impact Statement and move the process through as it needs to be moved. Does the County Legislature want to request to assume lead agency status and if so do you want a resolution prepared for Ways and Means on the 19th.

Lattimore, I would assume lead agency.

Farrell, I would like to know more, when we accept lead agency what are the further responsibilities, implications of wearing that hat on the project.

Westphal, the process at the 60,000 foot level is an environment assessment form is prepared, documents are looked at, the city did a lot of work, the answers to all the questions are contained in the documents, somebody from the county, maybe have Planning go through the document and preparing form, which is the part 2 of the environmental assessment form, come back before the Legislature and say; hear is what we think and it could be a positive or a negative declaration, it could be a condition negative declaration, it would come back before this body, there would be a resolution that spells out all of the SEQRA related issues, this body would vote on it. If the county agrees to assume lead agency status, the county has to send all of those documents to any other involved agencies, they have 30 days to comment or may sign a consent, if they comment on it the comments are looked at and addressed, if no comments and they consent then the next stage is they come back before this body, 30 days latter and ask the legislature to adopt the findings, then the project could commence.

Farrell, once the project commences are we still going to wear that title hat of lead agency?

Westphal, yes, and the only time it would trigger any action by the county is if something environmental significant was found, if new information was discovered than the county as lead agency would have to address those issues.

Farrell, just those environmental issues as we go along?

Westphal, yes, and what happens after SEQRA is determined is anybody guess at this point.

Chairman Cuddeback, for the record, Mr. Pinckney arrived at 6:05PM.

Pecher, if we get sued again, which is quite possible, we have to defend the action?

Eligibility requirements are determined by each Participant's collective bargaining agreements and/or their personnel policies and procedures;

The Participants desire to reflect the current relationship of the municipal corporations and the current terms of their participation in the Cayuga County Health Insurance Consortium; the County and the other participating municipalities are executing this agreement restating the terms of the existing Cayuga County Health Insurance Consortium, clarifying certain terms of previous Agreements they signed, amending the previous agreement to reflect changes required through compliance with certain New York State Laws;

WHEREAS, Chapter 1019 of the laws of the State of New York for 1970 required that all municipalities adopt a code of ethics and a board of ethics; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 217 passed on the 12th day of December 1970, the County of Cayuga established a Code of Ethics and a Board of Ethics for Cayuga County; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 70-06 emended the Code of Ethics Board of Ethics for Cayuga County;

WHEREAS, the Board of Ethics recommended to the Government Operations Committee certain emendments to the Code of Ethics Board of Ethics for Cayuga County; and

WHEREAS, the Government Operations Committee hereby recommends to the Cayuga County Legislature certain emendments to the Code of Ethics Board of Ethics for Cayuga County; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the following changes be made to the Code of Ethics for the County of Cayuga:

ARTICLE III, Section 2.

Powers and duties.

- a) The Board shall render advisory opinions in writing to the officers or employees of the County regarding specific matters pertaining to potential conflicts of interest, filings and reporting requirements with respect to this Code and Article 18 of the General Municipal Law. Such opinions shall be rendered only upon written request by the officer or employee concerning only the subject of the inquiry as it pertains to the requesting person's own concerns, except that the County Administrator may request advisory opinions on matters of general concern.
- b) The Board shall accept from any member of the general public or form its own members or from any officer or employee of the County and consider any complaint or allegation, except an anonymous complaint or allegation, of conflict of interest on the part of any officer or employee of the County or any other violation of the Code. All such complaints or allegations are to be kept in the confidential records of the Board. Should the Board determine that there is apparent merit in the complaint or allegation, it shall send a copy of the complaint or allegation and a written invitation to the officer or employee so charged to appear at a private meeting of the Board and explain the apparent conflict of interest or Code violation. Should such officer or employee fail to appear in response to such invitation or should he or she appear and fail to satisfy the Board that there is no conflict of interest or Code violation, the Board may commence an adjudicatory proceeding in accordance with the Regulations for Adjudicatory Proceedings annexed hereto and made a apart hereof as Schedule A. At the conclusion of those proceedings the Board shall send a written report on the matter to the County Legislature. The report shall include findings of fact and conclusions of law and any recommendation as to penalties, including but not limited to fines or suspension, removal from office or employment. The report shall not be made public except by the unanimous vote of the board.
- c) The Board shall render advisory opinions in writing to officers or employees regarding specific matters pertaining to potential violations of this Code. Such opinions shall be rendered only upon written request by the officer or employee concerning only the subject of the inquiry as it pertains to the requesting individual's own obligations under this Code. Such opinions shall be on the advice of counsel employed by the Board of Ethics or, if none, of the County Attorney.
- d) The Board shall administer and enforce this Code and conduct any investigations necessary to carry out the provisions hereof. Pursuant to the powers and duties of the Board, the Board may administer oaths or affirmations, subpoena witnesses, compel their attendance and require the production of any books or records which it may deem relevant or material.
- e) The Board may make recommendations with respect to amendments to this Code to the Legislature.

- f) The Board, upon its formation, shall be governed by Regulations For Adjudicatory Proceedings in the form annexed hereto and made a part hereof as Schedule A. The Board shall maintain records of its opinions and proceedings in the County Attorney's Office.
- g) Notwithstanding the provisions of article 6 of the Public Officers Law, the only records of the Board which shall be available for public inspection are:
 - i. Written disclosures filed pursuant to this Code;
 - ii. Notices of hearings or proceedings;
 - iii. Notices of penalties imposed under section 7 hereof; and
 - iv. Advisory opinions with names of individuals redacted
- h) The Board may retain counsel admitted to practice in the State of New York subject to confirmation and funding approval by the Legislature.
- i) The Board shall be empowered to request support staff and assistance from the Legislature in furtherance of its duties and responsibilities.

1. <u>Intent and Purpose</u>

The Board of Ethics of Cayuga County has statutory authority to follow rules and regulations governing the conduct of adjudicatory proceedings and appeals relating to compliance with the Cayuga County Code of Ethics, and the conduct of hearings held thereunder.

These rules and regulations shall apply to all proceedings undertaken by the Board. Persons subject to the requirements of the law shall be entitled to receive an adjudicatory hearing or proceeding as to every action or decision as to them taken by the Board, including but not limited to extensions of time, waivers and/or exemptions from the disclosure requirements.

2. Definitions

- (a) "Board" shall mean the Board of Ethics established pursuant to the Cayuga County Code of Ethics.
- (b) "Hearing Officer" shall mean the presiding officer in adjudicatory hearings or proceedings conducted pursuant to these regulations, who shall be independent of the Board and of the County of Cayuga and shall be appointed by the Board a the expense of the County as such hearing officer shall reside and conduct his or her principal business outside of the County.

3. Notice of Hearing or Proceeding

- (a) Where the Board elects to go forward with a proceeding to determine compliance with the requirements of State and local law, or to take such other action as may be authorized by law, the Board shall serve a written notice, by certified mail or other appropriate method of service authorized under the Civil Practice Law and Rules, to the parties and their representatives of record at least twenty (20) calendar days prior to the date of any hearing or proceeding under these rules. The Notice of Hearing or Proceeding shall contain the following:
 - i. A statement of the time and place of the hearing or proceeding;
 - ii. A statement of the nature of the hearing or proceeding;
 - Reference to the particular statutes and rules relevant to the hearing or proceeding;
 - iv. A short, plain language statement of the violations asserted, if any, including identification of all persons known to the Board as of the date of the Notice having knowledge or information concerning the alleged violation; and
 - v. A statement for hearing impaired parties and participants concerning the provision of deaf interpretation services without charge.
- (b) A copy of these regulations shall accompany each Notice of Hearing or Proceeding which is sent pursuant to these regulations.
- (c) The Notice of Hearing or Proceeding shall contain information concerning circumstances under which an adjournment may be granted and the result of failure to appear for a scheduled hearing or proceeding.
- (d) The Notice of Hearing or Proceeding shall inform the parties and their representatives of the right of each party to be represented, to testify, to produce witness, to present documentary evidence, and to examine opposing witnesses and evidence.

4. Time and Place of Hearing or Proceeding

- (a) The time and place of the hearing or proceeding shall be contained in the Notice of Hearing or Proceeding.
- (b) The time and place of the hearing or proceeding shall not be changed unless a party formally requests a change pursuant to the adjournment request procedure contained in Section 8 hererof.
- (c) The time and place of the hearing or proceeding shall, as far as practicable, take into account the convenience of the parties and the availability of witnesses.

5. Evidence and Proof

(a) The formal rules of evidence do not apply to adjudicatory hearings or proceedings conducted pursuant to these rules. However, the rules of privilege recognized by law shall be given effect. Objections to evidentiary offers may be made and shall be a part of the record. Subject to these rules, any party may, for the purpose of

expediting the hearing or proceeding and when the interests of the parties will not be substantially prejudiced thereby, submit all or part of the evidence in written form.

- (b) The hearing officer may exclude irrelevant or unduly repetitive evidence or cross-examination from any hearing or proceeding.
- (c) The burden of proof shall be upon the Board of Ethics to establish by clear and convincing evidence the facts and findings which support its decisions, including but not limited to a finding that non-compliance with the requirements of law has had or will have a material bearing on the discharge of the official duties of the person subject thereto.
- (d) No decision or determination by the hearing officer or the Board shall be made except on consideration of the record as a whole, or such portions thereof as may be cited by any party to the hearing or proceeding and as supported by and in accordance with substantial evidence.
 - (e) Each party shall have the right of cross-examination.
- (f) Official notice may be taken of all facts of which judicial notice may be taken and of other facts within the specialized knowledge of the Board. When official notice is taken, every party shall be given notice thereof and shall, on timely request, be afforded an opportunity prior to decision to dispute the fact or its materiality.
- (g) All findings of fact shall be based exclusively on the evidence in record and on matters officially noticed.
- (h) In making its findings and decisions and carrying out its duties with regard to ensuring compliance with State laws and the Cayuga County Code of Ethics, the non-compliance has a material bearing on the discharge if the person's official duties and that such non-compliance was willful can the enforcement and punitive powers of the Board be exercised.

6. Representation

Any person compelled to appear in person, or who voluntarily appears in any hearing or proceeding conducted according to these rules, shall be accorded the right to be accompanied, represented, and advised by counsel. Nothing herein shall be construed either to grant or to deny to any person who is not a lawyer the right to appear for or represent others in any hearing or proceeding herein.

Oaths

- (a) All oaths required by these rules may be taken before any person authorized to administer oaths within the State of New York
- (b) Oaths shall be administered to all witnesses who testify or appear in any adjudicatory proceeding conducted pursuant to these rules.

8. Adjournments

- (a) Adjournment of any hearing or proceeding conducted pursuant to these rules shall be granted only for good cause.
- (b) Written requests for adjournment shall be submitted to the hearing officer in the hearing or proceeding for which the adjournment is sought. The request must be accompanied by an affidavit which contains sufficient detail to allow the hearing officer to rule on the request.

9. Time Limits

(a) Under these rules adjudicatory proceedings shall be conducted in an expeditious manner with all due regard for the rights of the parties concerned. Every effort should be made by the parties to effectuate a speedy disposition of the case.

(b) Parties to any hearing or proceeding are required to file all papers, statements, proofs, and other evidence with the hearing officer at a time to be designated by the officer. An extension of time for filing those items will be granted by the hearing officer only upon formal request.

10. Decision after Hearing or Proceeding

- (a) All final recommendations of the hearing officer, and all decisions and determinations of the Board shall be in writing or stated in the record and shall include findings of fact, conclusions of law, and reasons for the decision or determination and, when appropriate, shall direct that specific action be taken by the parties. The final decisions or determinations of the Board shall be binding upon the Board.
- (b) A copy of all final decisions and determinations of the Board and recommendations of the hearing officer shall be made available to the parties to the hearing or proceeding, and shall be delivered or mailed forthwith to each party and to its representative of record.
- (c) Except as provided in the Cayuga County Code of Ethics or as otherwise provided herein, members of the Board shall not communicate directly or indirectly with any party or representative thereof in connection with any pending adjudicatory proceeding.
- (d) The Board shall maintain the final decision or determination in any adjudicatory proceeding in a file with an index by name of party and subject matter. The index and the notice of civil assessment, if any, shall not be made available for public inspection and copying except as provided in Section 16 of these rules. Each decision or determination shall be so filed and indexed within sixty (60) days after having been rendered.

11. Conduct of Hearings

The hearing officer, exercising discretion, may elect to conduct any hearing or proceeding under these rules ex parte after a showing that the party who is the subject of the hearing and its representative of record have been notified by certified mail of the pending hearing or proceeding or otherwise served with notice of the hearing. The party who is the subject of the hearing shall at no time be deprived of the opportunity to appear. However, if a party has been served with two (2) written notices of a hearing and fails to appear after each notice, the hearing officer upon proof of service, shall have the authority to proceed with the scheduled hearing. Proof of service shall consist of a signed certified mail receipt or affidavit.

12. Hearing Officer

All hearings or proceedings under these rules shall be conducted by a hearing officer, retained and provided by the County, who shall have the power and authority of presiding officers or hearing officers as defined by the State Administrative Procedure Act (SAPA), any other pertinent statute or local law, ordinance, or resolution, and these regulations. The hearing officer shall be an individual who has in no way been involved with the action or proceeding in question.

13. Powers and Duties of Hearing Officer

A hearing officer is authorized to do the following in any hearing or proceeding to which he or she is assigned:

- (a) Administer oaths and affirmations;
- (b) At the request of any party, sign and issue subpoenas in the name of the Board requiring the attendance and giving of testimony by witnesses and the production

of books, papers, documents, and other evidence. Subpoenas shall be regulated by the Civil Practice Law and Rules. Nothing herein contained shall affect the authority of an attorney for a party to issue subpoenas under the provisions of the Civil Practice Law and Rules:

- (c) Provide for the taking of testimony by deposition;
- (d) Regulate the course of the hearings, set the time and place for continued hearings and the time for filing of briefs and other documents;
- (e) Direct the parties to appear and confer to consider the simplification or settlement of the issues by consent of the parties; and
 - (f) Prepare findings of fact and recommendations.

14. Fines, Penalties

- (a) At the close of the hearing or proceeding, the hearing officer shall make findings of fact and a recommendation as to the appropriate penalty or fine to be assessed or any other action to be taken. The proposed findings of fact and recommendation shall be transmitted to the Board for approval and simultaneously mailed or delivered to the parties to the proceeding. The parties shall have an opportunity to respond in writing, in the form of a brief, to the findings of fact and recommendation of the hearing officer, and such written response shall be directed to the Board for its consideration within fifteen (15) days after the service of the hearing officer's findings and recommendations upon the parties. In their brief submitted in response to the findings of fact and recommendation of the hearing officer, the parties may not submit or discuss evidence which is not a part of the official record of the hearing or proceeding. The Board shall act on the findings of fact and recommendation as expeditiously as possible. The Board may affirm or reverse the findings of fact and recommendation of the hearing officer in whole or in part, or it may remand and/or dismiss the proceeding based upon the record produced at the hearing.
- (b) The assessment of penalties under the Cayuga County Code of Ethics shall not preclude the referral of an appropriate violation to a prosecutor for prosecution of criminal charges.
- (c) If the alleged violation has been established, and the Board determines in light of all the circumstances that the violation is not serious enough to warrant assessment of penalty, the Board in its discretion may take such other action as appropriate, including but not limited to a written admonition or a recommendation that disciplinary action be taken. The Board may forward a copy of such admonition or a recommendation for disciplinary action to the individual's appointing authority, as appropriate.

15. Records of Hearing or Proceeding

- (a) The record in hearing or proceeding under these rules shall include:
 - i. All notices, pleadings, motions, and intermediate rulings;
 - ii. Evidence presented;
 - iii. A statement of matters officially noticed, except matters so obvious that a statement of them would serve no useful purpose;
 - iv. Questions and offers of proof, objections thereto, and rulings thereon;
 - v. Proposed findings and exceptions, if any;
 - vi. Any findings of fact, conclusions of law, or other recommendations made by the hearing officer; and
 - vii. Any decision, determination, opinion, order, or report rendered.

(b) The Board shall make a complete record of all hearings and proceedings conducted before it. For this purpose, unless otherwise required by statute, the Board may use whatever means it deems appropriate, including but not limited to the use of stenographic transcriptions or electronic recording devices. Within a reasonable time after the Board gives notice of its decision, determination, opinion, or order, but before commencement of judicial review, any party to the hearing or proceeding may request the Board to prepare the record or any part thereof, together with any transcript of the hearing or proceeding or any part thereof. The Board shall then prepare the requested portions of the record and transcript within a reasonable time and furnish a copy to the requesting party at no charge.

16. Privacy/confidentiality

- (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 6 of the Public Officers Law, the only records of the Board of which shall be available for public inspection are:
 - Written disclosures filed under section 5 of the Cayuga County Code of Ethics.
 - ii. Notices of hearings or proceedings;
 - iii. Notices of penalties imposed under section 14 hereof; and
 - iv. Advisory opinions with names of individuals redacted.
- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 7 of the Public Officers Law, no meeting or proceeding of the Board shall be open to the public, except as expressly provided otherwise by the Board.
- (c) Information which would reveal confidential material protected by Federal or State statute shall be deleted from any final decision, order, determination, or declaration issued by the Board.

ARTICLE 29 OF SUCH LAW AND TO PRESERVE THE AUTHORITY OF CERTAIN COUNTIES AND A CITY TO IMPOSE SUCH TAXES AT RATES IN EXCESS OF FOUR PERCENT; AND TO REPLEAL CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF SUCH LAW RELATING THERETO

WHEREAS, the Cayuga County Legislature strongly supports this home rule legislation as it provides mandate relief and enhanced fiscal management tools for local governments; and

WHEREAS, County and State legislative staff, along with elected officials, currently spend significant time and energy in order to deal with the renewals of existing local sales tax rate legislation every two years under the current State legislative model; and

WHEREAS, the proposed legislation would end the practice of requiring state approval and renewal for local sales tax rate changes, up or down, that do not exceed four percent; and

WHEREAS, this will also allow county officials to manage their local sales tax rates in a way that is most efficient for local tax payers, and will reduce waste and redundancy in state and local legislative procedure; and

WHEREAS, County leaders make home rule requests out of necessity, as they are necessary in order to finance, implement and deliver state and federally mandated programs, ensure local public health and safety, foster economic development and enhance local quality of life services demanded by county residents; and

WHEREAS, these home rule requests allow local officials to manage their budgets and pay for state mandated and other services in the least intrusive and burdensome way for local taxpayers and are often requested to limited or prevent property tax increases; and

WHEREAS, this legislation would also provide counties with an important local fiscal management tool consistent with similar financial management flexibility granted to New York City a few years ago; now therefore be it
