## **Cayuga County COVID-19 Situational Update as of 5:15pm**

### **New Cases -**

Five new cases. They are identified as:

- A male in his mid-50's, living outside the City of Auburn.
- A male in his mid-20's, living outside the City of Auburn.
- A male in his mid-20's, living outside the City of Auburn.
- A male in his early 30's, living outside the City of Auburn.
- A female in her mid 20's, living inside the City of Auburn.

### **Confirmed Cases – total year to date**

There have been thirteen (13) total confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Cayuga County. Of the 13, three have been discharged from isolation and have recovered.

### **Test Results Received –**

Number of test results received since testing began in early March – **401** as of today.

- This information includes all testing of Cayuga County residents by physicians, healthcare facilities and licensed clinical laboratories.

### **Results pending –**

As of today, we are awaiting the results of 49 tests that were performed on Cayuga County residents by the Cayuga County Health Department, physicians, healthcare facilities and licensed clinical laboratories.

### **Hospitalized patients**

3 individual are hospitalized, of the ten cases in isolation.

### **Deaths**

There have been no deaths related to COVID-19 in our county.
