Cayuga County COVID-19 Situational Update as of 4:45pm

The Cayuga County Health Department continues to receive complaints from concerned citizens related to mass gatherings and proper use of face coverings. As a department we try to educate people about COVID-19 and the current regulations in New York State. In order to limit the spread of COVID-19, gatherings of 50 or more people are prohibited by law in public and private venues, except where specifically identified by New York State such as a restaurant or house of worship, which have their own regulations. Use of face coverings, except for persons medically exempt, is required of all people over age 2 in public settings indoors and outdoors when safe social distancing is not performed. Business owners and operators are required to uphold these regulations or deny admittance to the business. Enforcement action will be taken as a consequence of repeated violations.
