- The End of Watch Ride to Remember, honoring fallen officers from across the United States, stopped at our Sheriff's Office in July to pay tribute to former Undersheriff Stephen McLoud. Undersheriff McLoud passed away as a result of cancer that he contracted due to his service at Ground Zero in 2001.
- Sheriff Schenck and members of our Sheriff's Office continue to partner and work with local social justice organizations to address issues related to discrimination and racism in our community.
- We have begun hiring Special Patrol Officers who will serve in the Cayuga County Court and Office Buildings maintaining safety and security as those buildings start to increase the services that have been impacted by the Covid Pandemic.
- During the month of July, Captain John Mack was honored for reaching thirty years of service to the citizens of Cayuga County in our Custody Division. Captain Mack is an integral piece in maintaining the safe and secure custody facility here in Cayuga County.
