A Cayuga County resident who had tested positive for COVID-19 and was hospitalized, has passed away. The decedent, a female in her 60's had been hospitalized and may have had underlying chronic health issues which could have contributed to her death. Out of respect for the privacy of the deceased and her family, we will not be releasing further information.
