Upcoming Clinics

The Cayuga County Health Department will be holding a COVID-19 vaccination clinic Saturday, October 23, 2021 from 10am-12pm.

****REGISTRATION OR WALK-INS WELCOME****

All three COVID-19 vaccines will be offered. To register for an appointment visit: www.cayugacounty.us/health

This clinic will be held in the former Joann Fabric location. You must enter the clinic through outside door at the front of the mall. Please look for signs to the left of the Bass Pro Shop.

Moderna and Johnson & Johnson are approved for those who are 18 years of age and older. Children 12 years of age and older are eligible for the Pfizer vaccine and a parent or guardian must accompany anyone under 18 years of age at this clinic.

Cayuga County Health Department is participating in the #VaxtoSchool campaign, which is program administered by New York State to target unvaccinated 12-17 year olds to get vaccinated. Any child in this age group who receives their **first or second dose Pfizer vaccine** beginning October 2, 2021 through November 19, 2021 at a Cayuga County Health Department vaccination clinic will be given a \$25 Amazon gift card. COVID19 is still a risk for individuals of all ages, including children and adolescents and getting vaccinated is the best way to protect yourself, friends, family and our school communities from the virus.
