- On October 29th, Custody Officer Bruce Watkins retired after 25 years of dedicated service to our Sheriff's Office and community. Best of luck Bruce!
- On October 27th, Sergeant Brian Myers provided a presentation to Auburn High School related to our drone program. We appreciate the opportunity and invitation from our friends at Auburn High!
- Custody Officer Kaleigh Brahney graduated from the Seneca County Custody Basic Academy on October 1st. Officer Brahney is completing her field training and currently serving within our jail.
- Thank you to Dick's Sporting Goods for donating sporting supplies for our members to distribute to area children in October.
- Our members recognized Domestic Violence Awareness Month by displaying purple ribbons on our patrol vehicles. We also wore purple and participated in Community Action Program's Domestic Violence Awareness gathering on the steps of the Cayuga County Court House on October 21st.
- Recently Detective Lt. Fred Cornelius joined Auburn Police Chief Slayton and our partners with Cayuga Counseling Services in Montana to visit the Polson Police Department. They learned about new strategies to support children impacted by drug abuse. Thank you to Polson Montana Police Department for hosting this great opportunity and for sharing all the great work you are doing. Thank you as well to Cayuga Counseling Services for providing this opportunity to collaborate.
- Fair Haven Mayor Jim Basile joined us for a patrol ride along on October 10th. We appreciate Mayor's Basile's interest in learning more about our agency and the services provided by our patrol division. On October 8th Mayor Basile and Sheriff Schenck collaborated to collect unneeded prescription medication for safe destruction in the Village of Fair Haven and provide public safety materials to Village residents.
- The Centralized Arraignment Part (CAP) Court within our jail was utilized for 62 pre-arraignment detainees in September.

- At the time of this report, we are housing 160 total incarcerated individuals in our jail. Of incarcerated individuals, 30 are Federal board-ins, 8 NY State Parole Violators that are facing new charges, and 2 Parolees that have been detained for violating their Parole.
