**TO ADOPT A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING PURCHASE AND SERVICE CONTRACTS TO BE AWARDED ON THE BASIS OF BEST VALUE PURSUANT TO NEW YORK’S GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW AND FINANCE LAW**

WHEREAS, there has been duly presented and introduced at a meeting of the Cayuga County Legislature held on April 28, 2020, a proposed local law entitled:

**A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING PURCHASE AND SERVICE CONTRACTS TO BE AWARDED ON THE BASIS OF BEST VALUE PURSUANT TO NEW YORK’S GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW AND FINANCE LAW; and**

WHEREAS, a resolution was duly adopted by the Cayuga County Legislature on June 23, 2020, directing that a public hearing be held by said Board on July 28, 2020, commencing at 6:00 P.M., at a meeting held electronically and broadcast live via YouTube at the following address: <https://youtu.be/grg6vAWceAg>, with members of the public directed to call in at 315-294-8051 to comment, to hear all interested parties on said proposed Local Law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to law and after proper notice having been given, the Cayuga County Legislature held a public hearing on said Local Law and finds that it is in the interest of the County to adopt said Local Law; now therefore, be it; and

RESOLVED, Local Law No. \_\_\_\_\_ of 2020, entitled “A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING PURCHASE OF SERVICE CONTRACTS TO BE AWARDED ON THE BASIS OF BEST VALUE PURSUANT TO NEW YORK’S GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW AND FINANCE LAW;” as so designated, be and the same is hereby enacted, waiving any and all defects and informalities in the adoption thereof, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the County Legislature publish notice of the adoption of the said Local Law in the official newspapers of Cayuga County, one time per week for each of two weeks, the first publication to be within ten (10) days of its effective date.

**LOCAL LAW NO.: \_\_\_\_\_ OF 2020**

**COUNTY OF CAYUGA, STATE OF NEW YORK**  
**A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING PURCHASE AND SERVICE CONTRACTS TO BE**  
**AWARDED ON THE BASIS OF BEST VALUE PURSUANT TO NEW YORK'S**  
**GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW AND FINANCE LAW**

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of Cayuga County, State of New York as follows:

SECTION 1: LEGISLATIVE INTENT

It is the intent of this Local Law, consistent with the powers granted to county government pursuant to County Law § 400(a), the Municipal Home Rule Law, and such other laws as may be applicable, to:

- A. General Municipal Law § 103 ("Section 103") sets forth the general rules applicable to the awarding of contracts for public works and contracts for purchase by a municipality.
- B. Section 103 requires that contracts for public work involving an expenditure of more than thirty-five thousand dollars and all purchase contracts involving an expenditure of more than twenty thousand dollars, shall be awarded by the appropriate officer, board or agency of a municipality to the lowest responsible bidder furnishing the required security after advertisement for sealed bids.
- C. Section 103 further provides that a municipality may award purchase contracts (including contracts for service work, but excluding any purchase contracts necessary for the completion of a public works contract pursuant to article eight of the labor law) on the basis of "best value," provided that the municipality implement such authority by local law.
- D. The Cayuga County Legislature hereby determines that it is in the best interest of the County of Cayuga and its residents for the appropriate officer, board or agency of Cayuga County, consistent with the purchasing policy established (and as may be amended from time to time) by the Legislature, to have the authority to award purchase contracts on the basis of "best value" as defined herein

SECTION 2: DEFINITIONS

For purposes of this Local Law, the following terms shall be deemed to have the meaning set forth:

- A. "Best value" shall mean the basis upon which a contract may be awarded after a competitive bid for the purchase of goods or services to the bidder which optimizes quality, cost and efficiency, among responsive and responsible bidders. Such basis shall reflect, wherever possible, objective and quantifiable analysis. Such basis may also identify a quantitative factor for bidders that are small businesses or certified minority- or women-owned business enterprises as defined in subdivisions one, seven, fifteen and twenty of § 310 of the Executive Law to be used in evaluation of offers for awarding of contracts for services. Factors that may be used to determine the "best value" and to award a contract to other than the lowest bidder, include, but are not limited to:
  - i. cost of maintenance for good(s) or service(s);

- ii. durability of good(s) or service(s);
- iii. quality of good(s) or service(s); or
- iv. product life of good(s) or service(s).

B. "Purchasing Agent" shall mean the appropriate officer, board, legislative committee or agency of Cayuga County, consistent with or as defined by the Cayuga County Procurement Policy, established, and as may be amended from time to time, by the Cayuga County Legislature, to have the authority to award purchase contracts on the basis of "best value" as defined herein.

### SECTION 3: DEPARTMENT OF BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

On and after the effective date of this Local Law, the Purchasing Agent may award purchase contracts, including contracts for service work, but excluding any purchase contracts necessary for the completion of a public works contract pursuant to Labor Law Article 8, on the basis of best value, as defined in State Finance Law § 163, to a responsive and responsible bidder

- A. Where the basis for award is the best value offer, the Purchasing Agent shall document in the procurement record and in advance of the initial receipt of offers, the determination of the evaluation criteria, which whenever possible, shall be quantifiable, and the process to be used in the determination of best value and the manner in which the evaluation process and selection shall be conducted.
- B. Where appropriate, the solicitation shall identify the relative importance and/or weight of cost and the overall technical criterion to be considered by the Purchasing Agent in their determination of best value.
- C. The election to award any such contract on the basis of best value shall be made by the Purchasing Agent in consultation with the Department Head and appropriate Legislative committee. In the event that no such election is made, purchase contracts will continue to be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder furnishing any required security in accordance with the Cayuga County Procurement Policy.
- D. Notwithstanding the appointive authority of the Cayuga County Legislature, the Legislature may, by resolution, delegate administrative authority and general oversight of the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds to a County Administrator or Deputy, the Chairman of the Legislature, or the Chairman of the Oversight Committee to which the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds shall report.

SECTION 4: SAVINGS CLAUSE. If any portion of this Law shall be adjudged by the courts to be invalid, it is the intention of the Legislature that said judgment shall not affect the remainder thereof if the remainder is sufficient to carry out the intent of this Law.

SECTION 5: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State.

**A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING FOR SALARY INCREASES FOR CERTAIN COUNTY OFFICERS ELECTED FOR A FIXED TERM, DURING THEIR TERM.**

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of the County of Cayuga, as follows:

**SECTION 1 – LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS:**

The COVID-19 pandemic was unforeseen and its impact unknown until late in the first quarter of 2020 and was not considered in setting the salary of the Chair of the Legislature. The effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have resulted in fundamental changes in the nature of the work and time commitment of the Chair of the Legislature, increasing significantly the demands on the position beyond those previously considered or anticipated. The legislature recognizes that, while the County cannot increase the pay of the Chair of the Legislature to be consistent with the new and extensive responsibilities of the position, the body wishes to acknowledge those changes in a tangible way, during the crisis. Funds were allocated in the 2020 budget to provide the capacity to hire and pay for administrative support if needed and that those funds have not been drawn upon.

**SECTION 2 – LEGISLATIVE INTENT:**

The intent of this Local Law is to set the annual salary of the Chair at \$65,000.00, prorated from June 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020. The change being made as a response to the COVID-19 crisis and is not intended to be permanent nor precedent setting.

**SECTION 3 – SALARY:**

**SECTION 4 – REFERENDUM:**

The provisions of this Local Law are subject to permissive referendum and shall not take effect until at least forty-five (45) days after its final adoption by the Cayuga County Legislature pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law § 24.

**AUTHORIZING AWARD OF BID AND EXECUTION OF CONTRACTS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF THE OWASCO FLATS WETLAND RESTORATION AND RIPARIAN BUFFERS INITIATIVE PROJECT PHASE 2**

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 316-11 established Capital “H” Project No. 11-2, Owasco Flats Wetland Restoration and Riparian Buffers Initiative Project; and

**WHEREAS**, Cayuga County has been awarded and will receive grant funds for the Owasco Flats Wetland Restoration and Riparian Buffers Initiative Project Phase 2 (the Project), a green innovation project, through the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation Green Innovation Grant Program (GIGP); and

**WHEREAS**, Cayuga County has developed final Bid Plans and Specifications (the “Bid Documents”) with Environmental Design & Research, Landscape Architecture, Engineering, & Environmental Services, D.P.C. that have been approved by the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation to construct the Project; and

**WHEREAS**, as authorized by Resolution No. 79-20, the County released an Invitation to Bid to obtain a Contractor to construct the Project, which yielded the receipt of three bids that were opened on July 16, 2020 and evaluated for responsiveness to the County’s needs, and one was found to meet the engineer’s cost estimate and the available grant funding; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposal from WoodStone Earth Construction, Inc., from Palmyra, NY, falls within the available and authorized grant funding provided by the GIGP grant awards and the Legislature wishes to award the contract to WoodStone Earth Construction, Inc., and authorizes the Chair of the Legislature to execute the contracts necessary to proceed with construction of the Project; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, Cayuga County hereby awards the construction contract to WoodStone Earth Construction, Inc., from Palmyra, NY, and that the Chair of the County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to sign all necessary documents with WoodStone Earth Construction, Inc., from Palmyra, NY, to construct the Project as defined as the Base Bid in an amount of \$ 327,830 as well as Alternates # 1, 2 and 3 in an aggregate amount of \$ 57,284, for a total of \$385,114, with a total phase 2 contract amount not to exceed \$400,000 to allow for minor project improvements and approved changes; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the cost of the Project be paid out of Capital “H” Project No. 11-2; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized to make the journal and accounting entries necessary to accomplish the same, and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the Cayuga County Department of Planning and Economic Development be authorized and directed to oversee the implementation of the construction contracts and take the actions necessary and appropriate to accomplish the intent of this resolution.

WHEREAS, the Highway Department working with our vendors have reduced the projected cost of Resolution 218-20 to \$1,404,298 saving \$1,378,979.54 that can be used for other roads; and

**AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATION OF \$82,000 FROM THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT RESERVE TO THE CAYUGA COUNTY WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY FOR THE PURPOSES OF CREATING A CENTRAL WATER DISTRICT (2/3 Required)**

WHEREAS, the Cayuga County Legislature recognizes that public health, public safety, economic vitality and protection of water quality all depend on reliable, affordable and available municipal water and sewer infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, in the absence of a regional water system the city of Auburn has become a de facto regional water supplier over the past 100 years by selling treated Owasco Lake water to an estimated 15,800 residents outside the city limits; and

WHEREAS, the city of Auburn has successfully provided a safe water supply for many years, its system is over 100 years old and has several points of potential failure; and

WHEREAS, the CCWSA, with funding support from the Cayuga County Legislature, has completed a master plan to determine the most cost effective method of providing reliable water and sewer services to Cayuga County residents for the next 100 years; and

WHEREAS, for decades a second regional source of water supply has been desired to provide reliability, expand service, provide emergency backup for existing customers and offer direct wholesale service to towns and villages; and

WHEREAS, the Master Plan prepared by the engineering firm of Barton & Loguidice reviewed options for a second source of water supply separate from Owasco Lake and determined that a deep water intake in Cayuga Lake would meet the criteria established for a new source at the lowest cost to the end user; and

WHEREAS, the Master Plan also concluded that developing the new source as an element of a new regional water supply system would be the most economical approach; and

WHEREAS, on August 27, 2019 the Cayuga County Legislature adopted the master plan and provided its support for the CCWSA to lead the regional approach to meeting water and sewer needs of Cayuga County; and

WHEREAS, the Master Plan suggested the creation of a new regional water district that would provide for participation and cost sharing among all benefiting customers; and

WHEREAS, the Cayuga County Legislature has the authority to create such a multi-jurisdictional water district and would do so subject to a referendum of property owners within the proposed District; and

WHEREAS, a detailed analysis of proposed District boundaries, project costs and assessments to properties that will benefit from the new system must be completed to provide property owners with information to make an informed decision and to meet mandates of State law; and

WHEREAS, the CCWSA has estimates that it will cost up to \$82,000 to complete the analysis and provide for materials and presentations to inform the affected property owners of the proposed District; and

WHEREAS, Cayuga County desires to provide financial support to conduct the work necessary to provide property owners with a basis from which to make an informed decision and meet requirements of State law for District formation; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Cayuga County Legislature will provide up to \$82,000 to CCWSA to retain an engineering firm to conduct the analyses necessary to determine costs and assessments associated with development and operation of the proposed Cayuga Regional Water District; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the funds are available from the Economic Development Resource Allocation within the County's unrestricted and unappropriated fund balance; and be it further

RESOLVED, that if the District is created the County will be reimbursed for their cost contribution for the District formation report and related activities pursuant to § 253 of N.Y. County Law.
