I. CALL TO ORDER & INTRODUCTIONS

Chair Shari Weiss called the meeting to order at 12:04 p.m. Introductions were made. Quorum was present. Paula Rubano introduced Brianna St.Clair as the new secretary to the ASA Subcommittee, effective in April 2023.

III. REVIEW OF MINUTES

Members were emailed a draft of the November minutes. On a motion by Jolynn Mulholland, seconded by James Slayton, the November 2, 2022, meeting minutes were approved. Motion carried.

IV. AGENCY REPORT Q & A

Reports were provided prior to the meeting. Following updates were provided at the meeting:

- A.) Auburn City Courts - Carol Colvin updated on the following:
 - a. 77 attending misdemeanor court; 15 behavioral court, and 5 in domestic violence court. Monitoring, mental health, treatment, and first-time offender courts are full.
 - b. Mental Health, homelessness, substance abuse, and disorder are acute.
 - c. Upcoming events include graduation on May 15th and a recovery walk May 23rd. The treatment court staff will be attending the New York State Association of Treatment Court Providers Conference.
 - d. They received a five- year SAMHSA grant which will allow peers in the court and community training.
- B.) Farnham - Eric Breese updated on the following:
 - a. The March target date OTP development has been delayed. They are needing to meet two benchmarks, DEA approval and hiring clinicians.
- C.) Auburn Police - Chief James Slayton updated on the following:
 - a. DWI patrol Fridays and Saturdays. In January there were 6 DWI arrest.

V. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- A.) Opioid Settlement Funds – CSB has awarded 3 full awards and 1 small award which includes, the expansion of C.H.A.D, the expansion and support of HEALing Communities, and Nick's Ride by imbedding peers in BHU, as well as, Break Barriers funds. CSB continues to review other proposals. A tentative plan has been developed to determine where the additional funds will be used.
- B.) Diversion Grant – Monika continues to work with the funding and contracts.
- C.) Mobile Crisis – Discussion took place on the various ways to contact mobile crisis. They continue to work on staffing and training for mobile crisis.

VI. OLD BUSINESS - None this month.

VII. NEW BUSINESS

- A.) C.H.A.D - JoLynn Mulholland gave a presentation on the *Cayuga Onondaga BOCES Criminal Justice Peer Survey*.
 - a. There were 105 BOCES students who were surveyed.
 - i. Some concerns of the survey included riding in a car with someone who is under the influence, anxiety and anger levels.
 - ii. Several students indicated interest training in Narcan.
 - b. The committee reviewed the report and discussion took place. A copy of the personation is available upon request.
- B.) Auburn Rescue Mission - Gary Mann was looking for recommendations for summer neighborhood activities and how agencies can participate.
- C.) Nick's Ride - Ashely Moench discussed safety concerns for peers when clients present under the influence of "Molly".


VIII. ANNOUNCEMENTS
