### PROJECT #1: WHOLESALE SEWER METERING AGREEMENT

Execute New Agreement		
<b>Category:</b> Sewer & Waste Management Systems	<b>Project Partners:</b> City of Auburn, Towns of Sennett, Owasco, Fleming, Aurelius	
<b>Description:</b> The municipal partners listed above will be executing wholesale sewer agreements which outline a 50/50 cost share and allow for the city to manage all wholesale sewer metering connections. For decades, these metering points have been neglected and ownership/maintenance responsibility has been unclear. As part of these agreements, the city and towns have hired an engineering firm to review every sewer interconnection. These interconnections will be reconfigured and constructed using current industry standard metering technology to ensure accurate and reliable meters.  Savings to each municipal organization will be 50% of the project cost as all redundant metering points will be eliminated. Total project cost is estimated at \$1,277,000. Due to the current agreements, half of the total cost will be saved by the city and each municipality which the meter serves.

## PROJECT #2: FUEL PURCHASE FROM COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Formalize Memorandums of Understanding		
<b>Category:</b> Transportation & Highway Departments	<b>Project Partners:</b> Cayuga County, City, Towns, and Villages, Auburn Enlarged City School District, Water & Sewer Authority	
<b>Description:</b> The Cayuga County Highway Department owns and operates its own gas and diesel fuel pumps for the use of county-owned vehicles. Many municipalities do not own their own fuel pumps or underground storage tanks and can achieve significant savings by purchasing fuel from the County Highway Department. The county plans to sign MOUs with interested entities for 2020. Fuel purchases will be tracked and savings documented by comparing fuel prices charged by the county to average NYS fuel prices or the avoided cost of investing in their own fuel pump.

## PROJECT #3: FORCE MAIN WHOLESALE SEWER AGREEMENT

Execute New Agreement		
<b>Category:</b> Sewer & Waste Management Systems	<b>Project Partners:</b> City of Auburn, Cayuga County Water & Sewer Authority (CCWSA)	
<b>Description:</b> The City of Auburn and CCWSA will be entering into a new wholesale sewer agreement to accept industrial waste from industry customers in the Cayuga County Industrial Park in the Town of Aurelius. This project allows for the necessary expansion and retention of a current industry customer in the park, which in turn has a positive impact on the county overall. This new partnership will also provide sewer service to the park at a wholesale rate. CCWSA has existing capacity, is familiar with force main systems, and has staff expertise to take over the management of this additional line. Net savings will be demonstrated as avoided costs in terms of additional staffing to the other municipalities.

<b>Description:</b> Cayuga County and other municipalities own and operate public works and other specialized equipment that few other municipalities purchase and own. By loaning out this equipment and trained operators to municipalities, savings can be realized. It is anticipated that this will result in the reduction of purchasing or renting duplicate equipment. The county and other municipalities plan to sign MOUs with interested entities for 2020. Equipment and operator loans will be tracked and savings documented by calculating labor and equipment hours based on NYS rental rates.

<b>Description:</b> The participating municipalities plan to purchase an asphalt roller together and use it jointly. The parties plan to sign a joint purchase agreement in 2020. Savings will be documented by calculating the depreciated avoided cost of investing into individual machines for these municipalities.

By sharing this expertise with municipalities, the county can assist them with grant applications, zoning ordinances, comprehensive plans, local waterfront revitalization plans, and other services for a nominal fee. The county plans to sign MOUs with interested entities for 2020. Savings will be documented by comparing fees charged by the county with consultant rates for similar services.


