Potential COVID-19 Exposure at Auburn Lowe's

The Cayuga County Health Department is informing the public of a potential exposure to COVID-19 at the Auburn Lowe's located at 299 Grant Avenue in Auburn. An Auburn Lowe's employee who resides in Cayuga County tested positive for COVID-19 and was working on Saturday, July 18, 2020 from 10am to 7pm; Sunday July 19, 2020 from 10am to 6pm; and Tuesday, July 21, 2020 from 10am to 2:30pm. Members of the public, who shopped at the Auburn Lowe's on any of these dates between the times listed above, should monitor themselves for symptoms of COVID -19 such as: fever, cough, shortness of breath, headache, body aches, scratchy or sore throat, loss of smell or taste, nausea and/or diarrhea for 14 days after the potential exposure.

If symptoms do develop, stay home and call your doctor for further guidance about testing. If you are elderly, have underlying medical conditions, or are immunocompromised, call your doctor early even if your illness is mild. In an emergency call 911.

If you do not have a healthcare provider please contact the Cayuga County Health Department at 315-253-1560.

We remind the public that it is still important to practice safe social distancing by staying more than 6 feet apart from others, limiting the number of trips out to stores and only sending one member from your household out to do the shopping. When in public settings, both indoors and outdoors, wear a cloth face covering when safe social distancing cannot be maintained. Continue to wash your hands often, cover coughs and sneezes, disinfect surfaces, and stay informed.
