The Wayne County Water and Sewer Authority is our provider of potable water and the annual report is based on their treatment and testing of the water that is supplied to the Authority for distribution.

1 – The level presented represents the 90th percentile of the 5 sites tested. A percentile is a value on a scale of 100 that indicates the percent of a distribution that is equal to or below it. The 90th percentile is equal to or greater than 90% of the copper values detected at your water system. In this case, five samples were collected at your water system and the 90th percentile value was the average of the first and second highest values (0.2325 mg/l). The action level for copper was not exceeded at any of the sites tested.

2 – The level presented represents the 90th percentile of the five samples collected. The action level for lead was not exceeded at any of the 5 sites tested.
