- Members of our Sheriff's Office are preparing for No Shave November. A number of our Road Patrol and Custody Division Members will be donating to charity in exchange for putting away their razors for the months of November and December. Our female Officers and Deputies will be allowed to paint their nails and have a streak of color in their hair during the charity event as well.
- The Centralized Arraignment Court at the jail was utilized for 64 court arraignments in October. Through the end of October, 480 detainees have been arraigned at the Public Safety Building.
- The Sheriff and Sergeant Sloan joined local law enforcement agencies in assisting the Special Olympics on October 29th - helping raise money for their programs at Dunkin Donuts in Auburn. Thank you to everyone that supported this worthy cause.
- The month of October was Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Our Sheriff's Office was proud to support efforts in our community to bring attention to this challenging issue that impacts so many people in Cayuga County.
- On Thursday October 22nd, Deputy Wes Burger participated and ran in the annual Special Olympics Torch Run. Deputy Don Helmer assisted with traffic control as well.
- On Thursday October 22nd, Road Patrol Lieutenant Michael Wellauer was recognized by the Unity House of Auburn and awarded the 2020 Open Arms award for his compassion and commitment to those we serve.
- Numerous children were recognized during the month of October by Sheriff Schenck and members of our Sheriff's Office for helping others in our community. Each child was awarded a certificate and Junior Deputy Badge made available by the Cayuga County Deputy Sheriff's Benevolent Association.
- On Monday October 5th, Captain John Mack, Lieutenant Michael Wellauer, and Sheriff Schenck met with members of the Harriet Tubman Center for Justice and Peace, the Auburn Human Rights Commission, our local chapter of the NAACP, and the Auburn Police Department to continue working on our Connecting Bridges Initiative. This "getting to know you" segment included discussions about personal backgrounds and introductions of those in attendance.
