New Cases

Friday, April 9, 2021 – eight new cases admitted

Saturday, April 10, 2021- fourteen new cases admitted

Sunday, April 11, 2021- twelve new cases admitted

Active Cases in Mandatory Isolation

129 Mandatory Isolation

Confirmed Cases – total since March 18, 2020

There have been 5,666 cases of COVID-19 in Cayuga County.

Hospitalizations

There are two COVID-19 related hospitalizations at Auburn Community Hospital.

Deaths

There have been 89 total Cayuga County deaths related to COVID-19.

Additional Information

There has been an uptick in the number of positive cases, which also increases the number of contacts. We ask for cooperation and compliance from anyone involved in contact tracing investigations. This is an integral part of reducing the spread of the virus.

In addition, we all need to continue to perform preventive measures which include: washing hands frequently, wear a mask when in public or within six feet of others who do not reside in your household, stay home when you are sick or symptomatic, and get vaccinated.

As reminder, all individuals age 16 and older are now eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccination. Most Cayuga County sites only have the vaccines (Moderna and J&J) authorized for those 18 years and older. However, 16 and 17 year olds can register for an appointment (Pfizer) at the Fairgrounds through the New York State Health Department website: <https://am-i-eligible.covid19vaccine.health.ny.gov/>
