New Cases

Monday, April 12, 2021 – fourteen new cases admitted

Tuesday, April 13, 2021 – nineteen new cases admitted

Active Cases in Mandatory Isolation

Confirmed Cases – total since March 18, 2020

There have been 5,699 cases of COVID-19 in Cayuga County.

Hospitalizations

Today there are five COVID-19 related hospitalizations at Auburn Community Hospital.

Deaths

There have been 89 total Cayuga County deaths related to COVID-19.

Additional Information

The rise in the number of positive cases subsequently creates a rise in the number of contacts. We urge those individuals who are COVID positive to reveal all contacts when the investigation occurs. The health department is only as effective as the information that is given to us during contact tracing. It is our duty to assist the community in reducing the spread of the virus, so we ask for your assistance by being forthcoming about your contacts when the investigation occurs.

As a reminder, all individuals age 16 and older are now eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccination. Moderna vaccine, which is authorized for those 18 years and older, is available to our community residents through the Cayuga County Health Department, Federally Qualified Health Centers, and pharmacies. However, 16 and 17 year olds can register for an appointment for the Pfizer vaccine at the Fairgrounds through the New York State Health Department website: <https://am-i-eligible.covid19vaccine.health.ny.gov/>
