### **New Cases**

Monday, October 4, 2021- 47 new cases

- 33 unvaccinated, 14 vaccinated

### **Active Cases in Mandatory Isolation**

174 Mandatory Isolation

### **Confirmed Cases – total since March 18, 2020**

There have been 8,255 cases of COVID-19 in Cayuga County.

### **Hospitalizations**

The Cayuga County Health Department will be hosting COVID-19 vaccination clinic on Friday, October 8, 2021 from 4pm- 5pm at the Fingerlakes Mall.

Moderna and Johnson & Johnson are approved for those who are 18 years of age and older. Children 12 years of age and older are eligible for the Pfizer vaccine and a parent or guardian must accompany anyone under 18 years of age at this clinic.

Cayuga County Health Department is participating in the #VaxtoSchool campaign, which is program administered by New York State to target unvaccinated 12-17 year olds to get vaccinated. Any child in this age group who receives their **first dose Pfizer vaccine** beginning October 2, 2021 through November 19, 2021 at a Cayuga county Health Department vaccination clinic will be given a \$25 Amazon gift card. COVID19 is still a risk for individuals of all ages, including children and adolescents and getting vaccinated is the best way to protect yourself, friends, family and our school communities from the virus.

### **Additional Information**

According to the CommCare database accessed on October 2<sup>nd</sup>, there had been 837 breakthrough cases in Cayuga County from January 1, 2021-October 1, 2021. These represented 2.1% of all fully vaccinated Cayuga County residents.
