Please enter through the back of the mall. You will not be able to enter through the inside of the mall.

<u>Saturday</u>, <u>December 11th</u>, <u>from 10am-12pm in the Events Center at the Fingerlakes Mall</u> (former Spirit Halloween store). This clinic will offer Pfizer pediatric first and second doses for those ages 5-11. Please enter through the back of the mall. You will not be able to enter through the inside of the mall.
