New Bivalent COVID-19 Boosters

The Cayuga County Health Department hosted our first bivalent COVID-19 booster clinic, Wednesday, September 22, 2022. Both Pfizer bivalent booster (approved for ages 12 and older) and Moderna bivalent booster (approved for ages 18 and older) were offered. Unfortunately, we had only received a limited supply of the Moderna bivalent booster and we did run out, but Pfizer bivalent booster was still available for people in attendance.

On Saturday, September 24, 2022 from 11:00am – 1:00pm we will be having another bivalent booster clinic and will be offering a VERY LIMITED amount of Moderna bivalent booster. We will also have the Pfizer bivalent booster for individuals 12 years and older. In addition to the new bivalent boosters, we will be offering first and second doses of Moderna (for individuals 18 and older) and first and second doses of Pfizer (for individuals 5 and older).

This clinic will be held at the Fingerlakes Mall (located at 1579 Clark St., Auburn) will be in the Event Center (at the former Spirit Halloween store located on the backside of the mall near the movie theaters). Entrance to this clinic is from the outside of the mall. There will not be admittance to the clinic from the inside of the mall. **Please park in the back of the mall and enter through the Event Center doors.**

Anyone entering the clinic must be wearing a mask. Please your insurance card and vaccine card if you have one.

The availability of the vaccine is not limited to just the health department. Individuals are encouraged to work with local pharmacies, federally qualified health centers, and healthcare providers to get an appointment. Parents looking for the COVID-19 vaccine for children under 5 years of age should contact their child's pediatrician or local pharmacy.
